COLONEL COMMANDANT'S REPORT

Hello Everyone

The Head of Corps, BRIG David Welch held the 2007 RAEME Corps Committee meeting in December 2007 which was attended by all RAEME Colonel Commandants and HOC staff.

Key issues covered include:

- HOC Cell is organizing a Corps Intranet website which will also be used for the development of an electronic RAEME pictorial display for the Bandiana Army museum.
- RAEME Craftsman Port has proved very popular and this year 20 Surveillance and Target Acquisition Regiment (20 STA) have been selected to organize the 2008 bottling
- The HOC Cell thanked our association for our donation to the Corps Fund. The Corps Funds are used for the benefit of Corps members in a variety of ways
- The committee agreed that a review of the Corps Fund Charter should be undertaken. The HOC highlighted the need for a review of the paragraph on the purpose of the fund and believed it should include a review of other corps funds such as the RAR fund. It was agreed that the recognition of service and other significant milestones should be incorporated in the corps fund charter.
- The committee thanked the RAEME Association of NSW for their efforts in providing Care Packages to RAEME soldiers serving overseas.
- The Committee has received a proposal from the RAEME Association of Queensland titled "Operation Spanner Pack". The Queensland association propose to take the lead on the next care package project for RAEME soldiers serving overseas on operation. The committee strongly supported the concept of providing care packages for RAEME soldiers serving overseas on operational service and agreed that the HOC organisation and corps funds should be used to assist where required. The smaller associations such as WA and SA have also expressed a desire to participate in the project however declared they do not have the capacity to do it on their own. It was felt that the smaller regional associations should not be excluded from participating in the initiative. MAJ Anderson will liaise with the smaller associations to assist in creating the

opportunity for all associations to be involved. It was agreed that any care package initiative must include all areas where RAEME soldiers are deployed on operational service. The HOC cell is to provide the necessary detail on soldier locations, numbers and relevant POCs for each area.

- The committee discussed the issue of having a representative from the RAEME Associations attend the corps committee meeting and the corps seminar. It was pointed out that the regions are already represented by the Colonel Commandant. It was also considered that the corps committee does not necessarily address regional association issues. The HOC stated that he is agreeable in principle for association representatives to attend the committee meeting and seminar.
- It was also directed that the HOC cell call for input to the corps seminar from the colonel commandants and regional associations.

The ANZAC Commemorative March

Friday 25 April commencing at 9:30am.

The AEME/RAEME contingent will be lead this year by our President WO2 Grant Kuchel. There has been a major reshuffle of starting points for units this year. Our unit is one of the few units who are not affected by the reshuffle, but our starting point has been moved forward by a few metres.

Any ANZAC Day March queries should be directed to our Unit Guides, Dutchy Holland on phone (08) 8294 4401, John Howard on phone (08) 8447 7681 or Bob Killoran on phone (08) 8270 2222.

The Assembly Point for Group 6 is almost the same as last year, ie the eastern side of Pultney Street but with the head between North Terrace and Rundle Street (see map on page 14).

The route is also the same as last year, north along Pultney Street, west along North Terrace, north along King William Road and right into Sir Edwin Smith Avenue to the dispersal area in Pennington Gardens.

Salutes (the Association Banner is to be lowered on the "eyes right") are to be paid at the National War Memorial and the South African War Memorial on North Terrace, and the Official Dais on the eastern side of King William Road near the Parade Ground at Torrens Training Depot.

Vehicles will be available for WWII veterans who can no longer make the distance.

Please let Penny Stone know (mobile 0409 141 205) if you require a seat (the vehicle will return passengers to Pultney Street immediately after Group 6 has been dismissed at the end of the March). **The RSL has allowed this vehicle to participate on the proviso that it forms up alongside AEME/RAEME but must drop back to travel in a "Pod" of vehicles behind Group 6 when they step off.** This is to prevent marchers directly behind

AEME/RAEME from being forced to breathe exhaust fumes.

All persons who have:

1. Served in the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, British Commonwealth countries or any country which, at the time of such service, was an ally of Australia, or
2. Been allotted for duty in the March, are eligible to march.

Children are not permitted to participate in the March other than those who are Next-of-Kin of a deceased veteran and are 13 years of age or over. Those participating are required to wear the medals of the deceased relative (**over the right breast**) and are required to march with the Next-of-Kin Group 12 (assembly Point in Grenfell Street and on the Western side of Pultney Street or if a Legacy Ward with Legacy Group 1 (Assembly Point on the southern side of North Terrace 50 metres east of Kintore Avenue).

Whilst policy is that next-of-kin will only march in Group 12, the RSL recognises that certain exceptional circumstances may exist within individual units, which may prompt units to invite selected next-of-kin to join them. Whilst not encouraging or condoning this practice, the RSL recognises the unit's right to decide upon and implement such exceptions if they so desire.

The recognition of these exceptions should not be viewed as any change in the RSL policy that has existed for many years.

Free car parking facilities will be provided upon display of Service Medals or RSL Badge at:

1. Gawler Place Car Park 4.00 am- 6.00 pm
25 April (no entry/exit available possible between 8:00am - 11:00am)
2. Hungry Jack's Car Park 7:00am - 12:00
midnight 25 April (no entry/exit available possible between 8:00am - 11:00am)

3. Harris Scarfe's Car Park 7:30am - 6:pm 25 April

Toilet facilities will be provided as follows:

1. Council toilets in Hindmarsh Square
2. Ground floor level Hungry Jack's Car Park
3. Austin Street corner Pultney Street (portaloo x 1)
4. Kintore Avenue opposite State National War Memorial (portaloo x 2)
5. South eastern side of City Bridge for WWI veterans and VIPs
6. Rear of Adelaide University Oval and the Adelaide Oval

Approval has been obtained for Association members to meet in the Sergeants' Mess at Keswick Barracks for refreshments and a light luncheon after the March. Please be advised that the Standard of Dress for inside the Mess is neat civilian attire with a collared shirt. Blue denim is acceptable provided there are no holes or patches, but runners are not acceptable footwear.

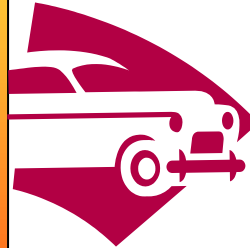

The bloke then guessed 8, and the proprietor said, 'You were close. The number was 7. Sorry, no sex this time.'

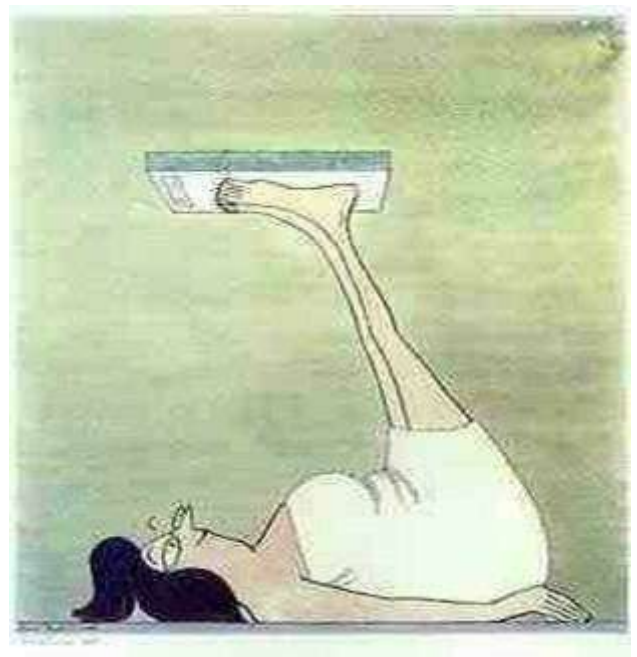

CHANGES TO EME IN 9 BDE

9 Brigade underwent a significant restructure in the second half of 2007, which is now bedding in well in 2008. This restructure, which has been part of Project Focus, set about brigading the majority of 9 Brigade's logistic functions. This saw the closure of Technical Support Troops (TSTs) and associated workshops in other units, and all EME personnel coming under the command of 107 Workshop Company, 9 Combat Service Support Battalion. The aim of this has been to reduce Corporate Governance related to Technical Regulatory Compliance at Unit Level, and to establish 107 Workshop Company as the centre for EME personnel within the Brigade.

The 107 Workshop Company is now responsible for the provision of 1st and 2nd line EME support to South Australian based 9 Brigade units. This requires the use, management and deployment of Forward Repair Teams (FRTs) to conduct 1st and 2nd line EME tasks for these units. This also means a more efficient approach to Corporate Governance with a reduction in duplications in the smaller organic unit workshops.

Changes have also meant extra positions in the Brigade for ARA tradesmen, starting the beginning of this year. This should assist with the supervision of ARTAP apprentices, which will hopefully be expanded in 2008/2009.

Another change that has occurred has been the establishment of a Technical Regulatory Framework (TRF) Compliance Cell at Brigade HQ. This Cell has been charged with conducting audits and ensuring that 107 Workshop Company is able to focus on the core business of providing 1st and 2nd line EME support to the units of 9 Brigade.

"No," replied the assistant, "that's the end of the queue." !!

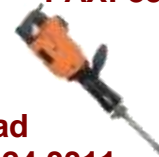
