Major items covered include:

- The committee recommended and the AGM accepted some minor changes to the constitution including:
 - Making the changes necessary to introduce the no fees for members over 75 year rule (passed at the 2008 AGM)
 - Making the COL COMDT the patron of the Association
 - Making the Senior ARA and GRes representatives ex-officio members of the Association Committee
 - Reducing the number required for a quorum at committee meetings
- The committee advised they had taken up the option of becoming an Affiliated Life Member of the Defence Reserve Association (DRA) at a one-off cost of \$300. Under ruling passed at 2008 AGM

Other item discussed include:

- SGT Nowak suggested that the Association approach the RAEME members in 7 RAR to avail them of membership of the Association. 7 RAR is moving permanently to the Edinburgh Defence Precinct in 2010 and has a large contingent of serving RAEME members. Secretary advised that the Assoc had received a letter from the ASM of 7 RAR, WO1 Paul Klieve offering to join the Association. They have eighteen (18) members in the RAEME element
- WO2 Kuchel advised the 2009 RAEME Port was now available for \$20 /bottle (cost price)
- WO2 Kuchel talked about the benefit of the spanner pack programme advising that it was well received by deployed RAEME members overseas. The programme was the envy of other corps. WO2 Kuchel advised the Association and function donations had resulted in a \$500 donation being made to the programme in 2009.
- 2010 ANZAC Function** - Decisions will be made regarding this function at the first committee meeting in 2010 and will be held on Saturday 17th April in the Warradale Other Ranks Canteen. To be confirmed.
- 2010 ANZAC Day Activities** – There are likely to be changes to the format in 2010 More details to follow.

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ANZAC DAY INFORMATION (From the RSL)

Background to the 2010 changes

While the veterans of the Great War marched in fewer than 20 separate units, or groups of units, in the Adelaide ANZAC Day March, those of World War II currently march as 141 separate ships, units, or squadrons.

Naval veterans of the Great War marched as one formed-body, as did veterans of both the Royal & the Australian Flying Corps. Our World War II Naval veterans currently march as 21 separate entities, and our RAF & RAAF veterans march as 28 separate squadrons, or similar groupings, by Theatre of Operations.

The additional distances, which are necessarily formed between individual units, have prevented us from forming-up most World War II veterans in North Terrace to shorten the distance they are required to march. Moreover, with the first half of the March comprising a large number of units with very small representation, the March is artificially lengthened - and made more difficult for older veterans.

As an example, in 2009 the first seven units in Group 3 (the World War II Army Women's Services) comprised a total of only 23 marchers, spread over a marching distance of 70 metres. The result will be that all World War II veterans up to, and including the existing Group 7 (Air Force - WWII) will assemble on North Terrace, and the remainder (Groups 8 & 9) relocating from Rundle Street to Pulteney Street.

The New Groups

The changes for 2010 will allow us to shorten the march for those veterans who currently march in Group 3 and Groups 5-9, by moving their Assembly Areas forward. The existing Groups 5 & 6 will combine to form the new Group 5; the existing Groups 7-9 will be renumbered as Groups 6-8, and; the existing Group 10 will be split into two, smaller, and more easily marshalled groups, to create the new Groups 9 & 10.

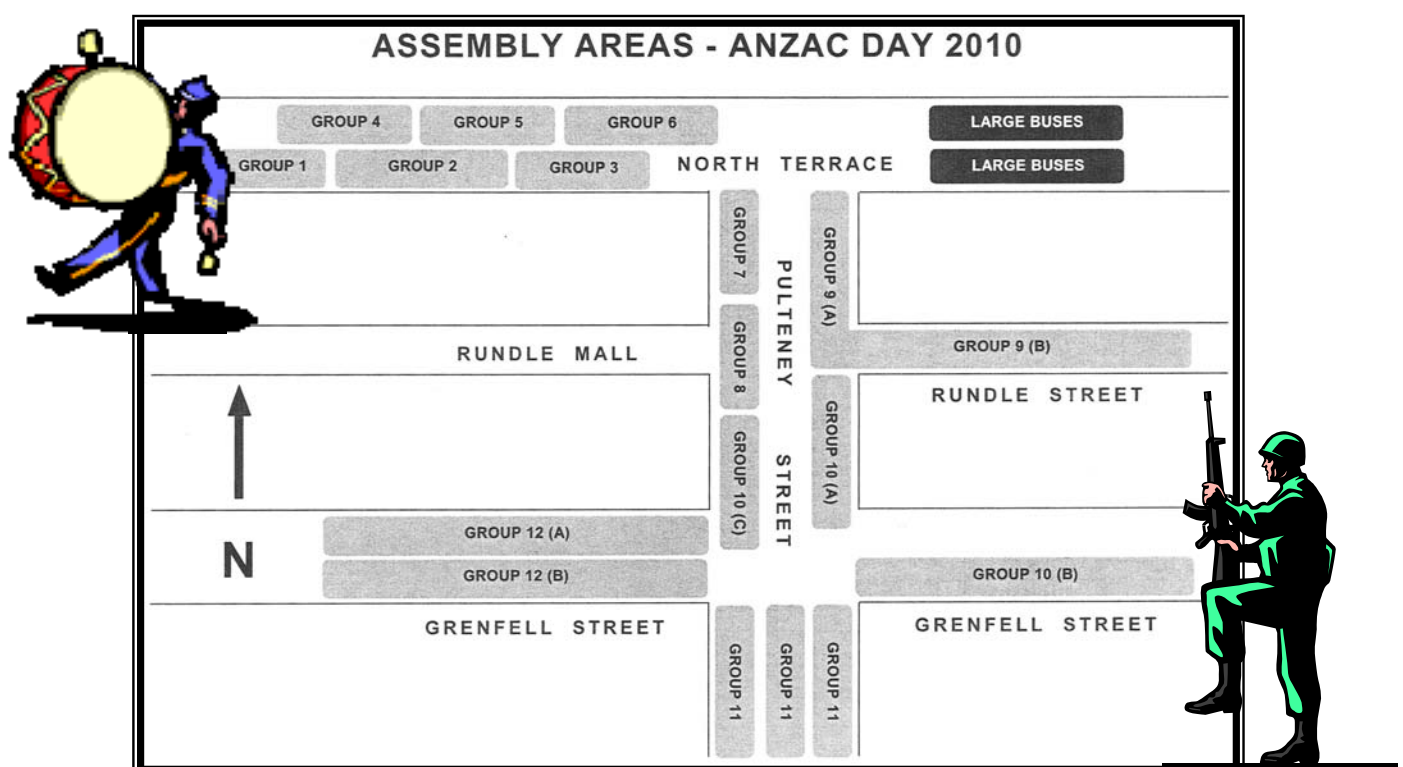
Most veterans in Groups 3-9 will assemble much closer to the start point, and march a shorter distance on the day. This may be by as much as 180 metres in some cases.

Sub-Groups within Groups 3-6

In all cases, the RSL's yellow unit identity signs will still be carried, side-by-side in a single rank at the front of the sub-group, and individual unit flags, signs, and banners will still be paraded, but in a single rank behind the yellow signs, and immediately in front of the veterans.

Example - Group 4: the various units comprising the 6th Australian Division, whose veterans march in Group 4, will now form-up and march as a divisional sub-group, rather than as individual units. The same principle will apply for the 7th, 8th, and 9th Australian Divisions.

"Your horse phoned!"



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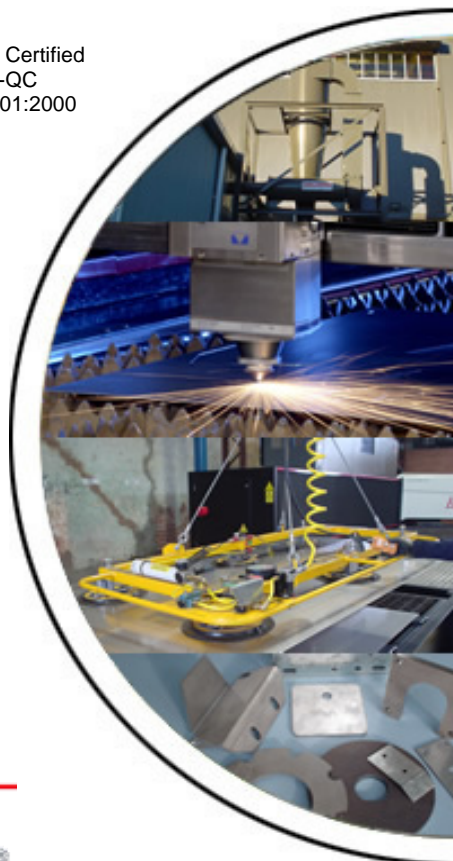
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## **MEMBERSHIP**
