The aim is to develop a national affiliation of State and Territory Associations by forming a national body which will work to achieve better outcomes for those things which currently create problems for local associations.

It is believed it would benefit all in a positive manner and in particular identify a common set of goals for all associations and hence support the members of the Corps, provide financial savings and share national tasks and projects.

HOC has agreed to have a National Association funded representative on the Corps Committee, who attends on behalf of all associations as a method of representing association views at the national level



ANZAC DAY 2010 MARCH REPORT

This year saw a big reorganisation of the Anzac Day Parade with major changes to the arrangements for all World War 2 units and subsequent changes to the remainder of the marchers. The aim was to focus the attention of the march on to those remaining WW 2 veterans who were able to participate and to shorten the distance they had to march.

For RAEME it meant the separation of AEME/RAEME Assoc members from those who participated in WW 2. The WW 2 veterans remained nearer the front of the march with the WW 2 groups and were part of Group 5 with other WW 2 logistic units. I was later informed only two WW 2 RAEME veterans participated and they were included in the Logistic Group and our RAEME roundel was paraded at the front of the group.

The AEME/RAEME veterans were included as part of Group 12A with other post WW 2 Associations (in front of the Next-of-Kin Group) Group 12A formed up in Grenfell Street near the corner of Pulteney Street and this is likely to be our location for future marches. Like many changes and new ideas there were quite a few teething problems to be sorted out before the AEME/RAEME group formed up and the marshals were convinced we were all in the right location.

This year AEME/RAEME was led by MAJ (Adj) Lee while our association banner was carried by Frank Owen and a Victorian visitor who served in 106 Fd Wksps. This year we marched in rows of 6 and had 40 members "on parade".




