

Nominations should be submitted to:



W02 Grant Kuchel is Awarded the Federation Star

The Federation Star forms part of the Long Service Awards and is presented to members of the Defence Force who have provided 40 years of service. I think we can all appreciate that there are not too many people who would become eligible for this recognition and acknowledge that 40 years of service is an outstanding achievement.

Earlier this year WO2 Doug Pammenter was a recipient of this award. Now we have another member, WO2 Grant Kuchel who has also reached this milestone and recently travelled to Canberra to be presented with his Federation Star.

It is appropriate that we delve into the past of Grant and see what he has achieved over the past 40 years as a member of the ADF and RAEME.

Grant is a local South Australian being born in Victor Harbor way back in 1952 on the 12th of February. After surviving Yankalilla High School, Grant enlisted into the ARA via the Adult Trade Scheme (thick) on 4th March 1969. He was initially enlisted with the intent to be trained as an Electrical Fitter, however, circumstances changed and as Grant was obviously too intelligent to be in the electrical trades he trained as a Vehicle Mechanic.

Grants first posting was to Puckapunyal Area Workshops where he worked on International Trucks, Ferret Scout Cars and Centurion Tanks. It is interesting to note that all of these types of equipment are now museum articles. In 1971 Grant married his childhood sweetheart Christine. Their children Amanda, Matthew and Craig arrived in the following years as they moved around.

Grant spent 2 years in Port Moresby PNG as a Corporal before returning to Australia in 1977. His numerous postings include 21 Supply Bn, 131 Supply Coy on promotion to SGT, EIS Melbourne and in 1985 promoted to WO2 at 3 Base Wksp. He then came back to Adelaide into the Trade Repair Officer at Adelaide Wksp Coy at Warradale barracks.

Grant's career now gets confusing, he discharged from the ARA in 1989, enlisted into the Army Reserve in 1990 as the ASM of 8 TPT Sqn TST and then he was then promoted to WO1 and posted as ASM 107 Fd Wksp 9 BASB. In 1996 Grant was awarded an Australia Day Medallion for services to 107 Fd Wksps and formation of the BASB. Grant was then posted to Tech Spt Pl HQ 9 Bde before transferring back to the ARA in 2000.

Back in ARA, Grant was posted to DNSDC/SME and in 2001 participated in Ex Long Look to the UK. Upon return he spent time at 9 CSSB, DLPP and then JLU(S) before discharging from the ARA to the reserves early this year. Grant is now posted to 9 CSSB and works for the 9 Bde Recruiting Cell.

As we all know Grant has been a long term and hard working member of the Association Committee including being our most recent ex President and is a Life Member.

On the 17th of September Grant and Christine were in Canberra and Grant was presented his Federation Star by the Chief of Army, Lieutenant General Gillespie AO, DSC, CSM, and RSM Army, Stephen Ward.

This is very fitting recognition for Grant and also Christine who has been with Grant through his many postings and provided excellent support to him and in recent years our association.

We congratulate Grant on his achievement of 40 plus years service to the Australian Army, 40 years in RAEME and wish him and Christine all the very best.

DVA Media Release

VETERANS WARNED OF POTENTIAL SCAMS

Veterans have been targeted by scam-artists claiming to represent the Australian Government, Secretary of the Department of Veterans' Affairs Mr Ian Campbell said today.

Mr Campbell said the Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) had been made aware of several approaches to members of the veteran community asking for personal information in exchange for new government services such as free electricity or pension benefits. In some cases these people posed as officers from DVA.

"These 'offers' are false and my Department is investigating these incidents," he said.

"Veterans in Queensland and Victoria have been most recently targeted however veterans across the country should be aware of the potential scams.

"I urge the veteran community to exercise caution when asked to release personal details.

Be cautious about when and to whom you release your personal information.

If you receive a phone call or letter asking for personal information such as your DVA client number or banking details, do not answer straight away. Contact your nearest DVA office on 133 254 (for metropolitan callers) or 1800 555 254 (for non-

metropolitan callers) to confirm the source is legitimate.

"It is disappointing that our veterans are being targeted by these cowardly scams and I encourage members of the veteran community to contact DVA if they have any concerns," Mr Campbell said.

The Government's Scamwatch website – www.scamwatch.gov.au – contains useful information on how to protect your privacy.

Progress Report on the "National Association" Proposal

The concept of a National Association has been discussed for a number of years, but no real progress had been made until the recent RAEME Head of Corps Conference where the concept, as produced by Ray Norman (President QLD Assoc), was accepted in principle. The proposal had the general support of all state based associations and is only an in-principle agreement.

The outcomes of the HOC Committee were to:

- approve the title "The RAEME Association";
- **provide** further guidance on the way forward;
- facilitate further development of The RAEME Association through their respective Colonels' Commandant, State Associations, Regional Chapters and Sub Branches;
- **approve** the rewrite of Corps Instruction No 12 to incorporate;
 - the proposed framework;
 - proposed Draft Charter;

Title of the Association

"The RAEME Association" and not "The National RAEME Association" was the preferred title and this requires little explanation. It is uniquely national and complies with Corps Instruction 12. All other RAEME Associations are identified by their regional location.

Proposed Framework

The Committee of *The RAEME Association* will consists of:

- The President who should be selected on an agreed rotation from one of the Regional Associations, Chapters or Sub Branches. This person would be a standing member of the Corps Committee.
- The Vice President, who is also the Representative Colonel Commandant.
- A Secretary and a Treasurer appointed from one of the Regional Associations, Chapters or Sub Branches.
- Representatives from each Regional State Association, Chapters and Sub Branches as required. (Note: Numbers of Representatives will be governed by the agreed goal and tasks to be performed as agreed and delegated by The RAEME Association President.)
- SO2 Corps heritage from HOC Cell.
- RSM /ASM of the Corps

The RAEME Assoc membership would consist of:

- All members of all Regional Associations, Chapters and Sub Branches by affiliation and association; and
- currently serving members of RAEME (free).

Proposed Charter

A proposed Charter was discussed and it is anticipated that a series of SOPs or Standing Instructions would be drawn up by the Committee to detail areas such as:

- Membership;
- Committee meetings;
- Interaction with Regional Associations, Chapters and Sub Branches;
- Financial management;
- Merchandising;
- Web Site;
- Insurance:
- Calendar of events; and
- Other agreed goals and tasks.

The interaction between *The RAEME Association* and the Regional Associations, Chapters and Sub Branches is still being canvassed, but the following general principle will apply:

- The RAEME Association should not interfere with the conduct of, or dictate terms to, each State Association, Chapter or Sub Branch.
- There will be no membership fees imposed by *The RAEME Association* upon the members. It is primarily a coordination body which will encourage financial membership of current and ex-serving RAEME members into the local Regional Associations, Chapters and Sub Branches.
- The RAEME Association is more focused on being the communication channel between the Regional Associations, Chapters, Sub Branches, the Corps Management and the currently serving Corps body. Importantly, it will provide the mechanism through which currently serving members are introduced to their respective Regional Associations, Chapters or Sub Branches.
- Where commonality exists between the Regional Associations Chapters, Sub Branches and advantages are gained through national agreed level coordination (eg merchandising, recording of history, web page linkages, recruitment,

pension and welfare support etc) then The RAEME Association should be the mechanism for this coordination.

Conclusion

The establishment of a national association, to be known as The RAEME Association, while still in its infancy, is supported by the Corps Committee as it will allow a closer relationship with the regional associations. It also provides a unique opportunity to achieve greater unity of purpose and operation across the entire RAEME network of Regional Associations and the Corps generally..

Critically, The RAEME Association will provide enhanced membership recruiting opportunities that have not been visible to the Corps or Regional Associations previously. Potentially it will achieve economies of scale in the purchase of Corps memorabilia, long term savings for the Regional Associations and facilitate the coordination of worthwhile activities like Operation Spanner Pack and support to the Corps Museum that have been long overdue.
