GUIDELINES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

This project provides a wonderful opportunity to record individuals' experiences, or those of their mates and colleagues. Therefore you should not be constrained from presenting your stories in your own style, but be aware that the editorial board reserves the right to "standardise" the style of storytelling throughout the publication. Writers may choose to draft a complete story, or provide dot points outline, from which a story may be created. Collaborations are welcomed. In either event, you will be asked to observe the following broad guidelines:

Outline the broad context of the story:

- **What** was the operation in which the formation, unit, sub-unit, team, individual(s) or equipment was engaged?
- **What** were the circumstances leading to the event depicted?
- **Where** was the broader activity being undertaken?

Identify, describe and explain the situation, action, event or activity depicted in the photograph:

- **Where** did the activity occur?
- In **what** operation, exercise or setting did the activity depicted occur?
- **Provide** the identity of any equipment, (aircraft, vehicle, plant or watercraft) or weapon(s) depicted in the photographs.
- **Describe** the degree of danger and/or technical and practical difficulty involved in the situation.
- **Explain** the outcome of the situation and what happened immediately after the situation depicted in the photograph.

Conclude the description of the event and story and relate it to the photograph:

- **Outline** the conclusion of the event and the consequences.
- **Sum-up** highlights of the event/experience.

Identify (name and rank) the soldier(s) depicted in the photograph. Also include as much background information on each soldier as possible. For example:

- **His** or **her** specific role in the activity shown.
- **How** long each soldier had been in the Army at the time of the activity depicted.
- **The soldier's origins** –did he or she start with RAEME as an apprentice, or was he or she an adult trainee, or entered the Corps by another means.
- **What** happened to them after the depicted situation ended?
- **Are** the individual(s) still serving, what rank did he or she attain during their service, or what civilian occupation did they go to after discharge/retirement?
- **Describe** any amusing anecdotes, regarding any of the soldiers depicted, during their time with the unit.
- **Were** any of the soldiers renowned for any particular skill/activity/behaviour (e.g. Service representative in sport, a particular character)? This information should be provided as an addition to the information provided to support the photograph.

As reported briefly in the February Newsletter our WW2 veterans remain near the front in Group 5, the Vietnam Workshops veterans are in Group 9(C) and the AEME/RAEME Association members are in Group 12(A).

Our Association ANZAC Day March co-ordinator will again be John Howard, look out for him and/or the Association Banner

The RAEME Vietnam Veteran's group now have their own banner and the group will be led by ADJ Lee again this year and they are looking for as many RAEME people as possible to march with them.

The route is the same as last year and Salutes (banners to be lowered on the "eyes right") are to be paid at the National War Memorial, the South African War Memorial on North Terrace and the Official Dais on the Eastern side of King William Road near the Parade Ground at Torrens Training Depot.

Vehicles will be available for veterans who can no longer make the distance. **Please let Don Harvy know (08) 7007 4470, mobile (0412 021 411) or email (harvy@adam.com.au) if you require a seat.**

The vehicles will return passengers to Pulteney Street immediately after the marchers have been dismissed at the end of the March. **The RSL is providing the vehicle(s) and they will form a "Pod" of vehicles behind each group.** This is to prevent marchers directly behind the veterans from being forced to breathe exhaust fumes.

Carers:

One carer or wheelchair pusher is permitted to assist a veteran within unit ranks. Wheelchairs to be in front row.

March Conduct and Paying of Compliments

Unit flags, banners and roundels are to be lowered for all salutes. Yellow unit identification signs are to remain upright and facing the front at the saluting points, except on approaching the Official Dais, where they are turned half-right for the salute on the order EYES-RIGHT and then returned to face the front on the order EYES-FRONT.

However, current serving members who are not eligible for membership of a Sergeants' Mess are not invited to attend and should attend their rank respective Mess. **Mess protocol dictates that all personnel attending the Mess should introduce themselves as a member of the AEME/RAEME Association to the PMC or the senior Mess member.**

A toothpaste factory had a problem. They sometimes shipped empty boxes without the tube inside. This challenged their perceived quality with the buyers and distributors. Understanding how important the relationship with them was, the CEO of the company assembled his top people. They decided to hire an external engineering company to solve their empty boxes problem. The project followed the usual process: budget and project sponsor allocated, RFP, and third-parties selected. Six months (and \$8 million) later they had a fantastic solution - on time, on budget, and high quality. Everyone in the project was pleased.
