





As many of you are aware, the intent of the project is to celebrate the achievements of individuals, sub-units and units of RAEME Corps during warlike, non-warlike operations and peacetime training activities. In short, the project team is still seeking stories on what individuals did at some stage during service in the Corps, which can be placed in a pictorial history of RAEME, to be published later this year. We are also still seeking your support to spread the message widely amongst your ex-RAEME friends, or colleagues, in your local region or beyond.

The Project Team, but in particular, the authors/editors, Max Carmichael, Keirin Joyce and Frank Benfield, have commenced compiling the book along the following broad guidelines:

Overall Progress. At this time, the Project Team is acquiring relevant stories to fit into the above chapters. We are experiencing difficulties acquiring stories for Ch 4, 5, 10 and 11 and a significant lack of photographs for all chapters. The project could also do with more stories from our other ranks to complement the many stories being provided by senior NCOs, warrant officers and officers – this will give the book a bit more balance.

More specifically, we would appreciate more stories to do with the Corps involvement with the maritime element, our several deployments to the Antarctica and our involvement in peace monitoring on Bougainville. To date, we have only one useable CMF/ARES story from the parttime members. We have no stories from Somalia.

Story and Photo. WO1 Paul Gibbs and WO1 Nick Rees have instituted a competition for best photo and story on RAEME Face book – a prize of \$500 each. This initiative has proven to be useful in promoting the Book as has the RAEME National Face book site. Retention of Material. It is also our intention to place all stories, data and photographs provided from all sources into the RAEME Book Repository where it will be retained at Bandiana for all time. So even if we don't use all the stories and photographs provided to the project team, they won't be lost.

Next Steps:

In summary, and despite the fact that all members of the team have a "day job", I assess the project has made sound progress and we are roughly on schedule. I must say that without naming anyone in particular, I have been well supported by my project team, and cannot thank them enough for all of their efforts to this point.

Visit to the REME Museum of Technology and presentation of an Association Plaque

On the 18th August this year, whilst our Treasurer, Ron Moran was in the UK, arrangements were made to visit and meet with MAJ R.J. Henderson (Retd) Director REME Museum of Technology and present an AEME/RAEME Association SA Plaque to the Museum at ArborField, Nr Reading Berkshire UK.



The presentation in the Commonwealth Display Room

The Corps of the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers Museum of Technology is home to displays on military and trade training chronicling the corps' role in 'keeping the punch in the army's fist'. A vehicle exhibition hall houses 20 specialist repair and recovery vehicles and there is a unique collection of early examples of military electronic hardware, test equipment and literature, said to be unequalled anywhere in the UK


The museum has an interesting history, the garrison was established in 1911 as a Remount Depot, which supplied the military with horses for both operational and ceremonial purposes.During the Second World War, the garrison functioned as the Army Technical School. Since its establishment, the garrison has been the location of a number of Army Apprentices College and technical schools.

ArborField is currently the location of the Regimental Headquarters of the Corps of Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers of the British Army. The garrison contains Hasbrouck Barracks, which is a training base for the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers (REME) School of Electronic and Aeronautical Engineering (SEAE). The potential craftsmen within SEAE, study in the school to learn a trade as aircraft technicians, avionics technicians, and electronics technicians,
