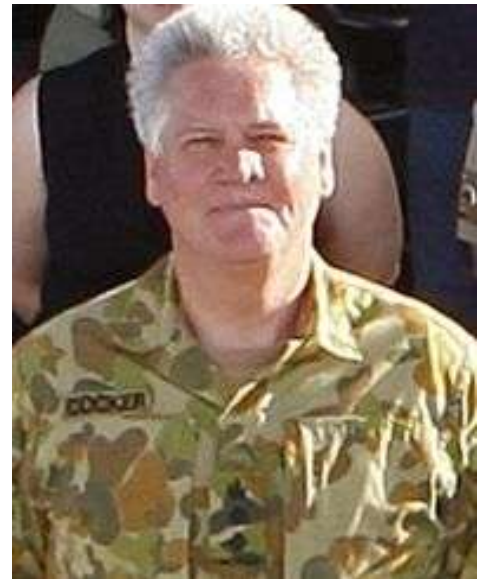
Please do not go the wrong building, you may still have a good time, but you probably won't know anyone.

From our Colonel Commandant's Desk

"Anzac Day" goes beyond the anniversary of the landing on Gallipoli in 1915. It is the day on which we remember Australians who served and died in all wars, conflicts, and peacekeeping operations. The spirit of Anzac, with its human qualities of courage, mateship, and sacrifice, continues to have meaning and relevance for our sense of national identity.

The Australian and New Zealand forces landed on Gallipoli on 25 April, meeting fierce resistance from the Ottoman Turkish defenders. What had been planned as a bold stroke to knock Turkey out of the war quickly became a stalemate, and the campaign dragged on for eight months. At the end of 1915 the allied forces were evacuated, after both sides had suffered heavy casualties and endured great hardships. Over 8,000 Australian soldiers had been killed. News of the landing on Gallipoli had made a profound impact on Australians at home, and 25 April soon became the day on which Australians remembered the sacrifice of those who had died in the war.



Although the Gallipoli campaign failed in its military objectives, the Australian and New Zealand actions during the campaign left us all a powerful legacy. The creation of what became known as the "Anzac legend" became an important part of the identity of both nations, shaping the ways they viewed both their past and their future.

To those who will march in memory, do so with pride in the knowledge that those who paid the ultimate sacrifice did so to allow us the freedom and privilege of respecting their efforts."

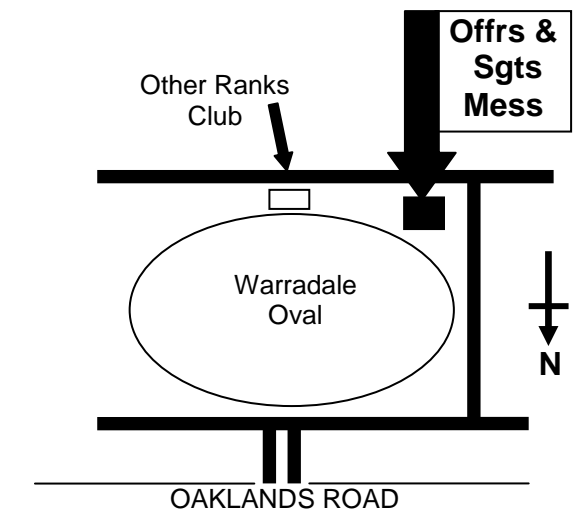

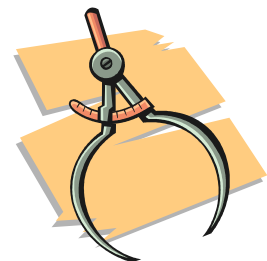
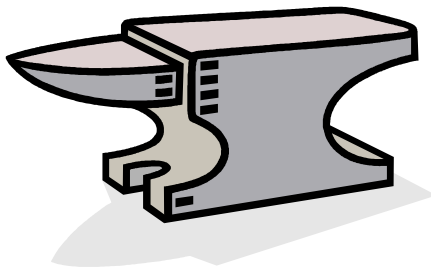
2015 RAEME MIXED ANZAC REUNION

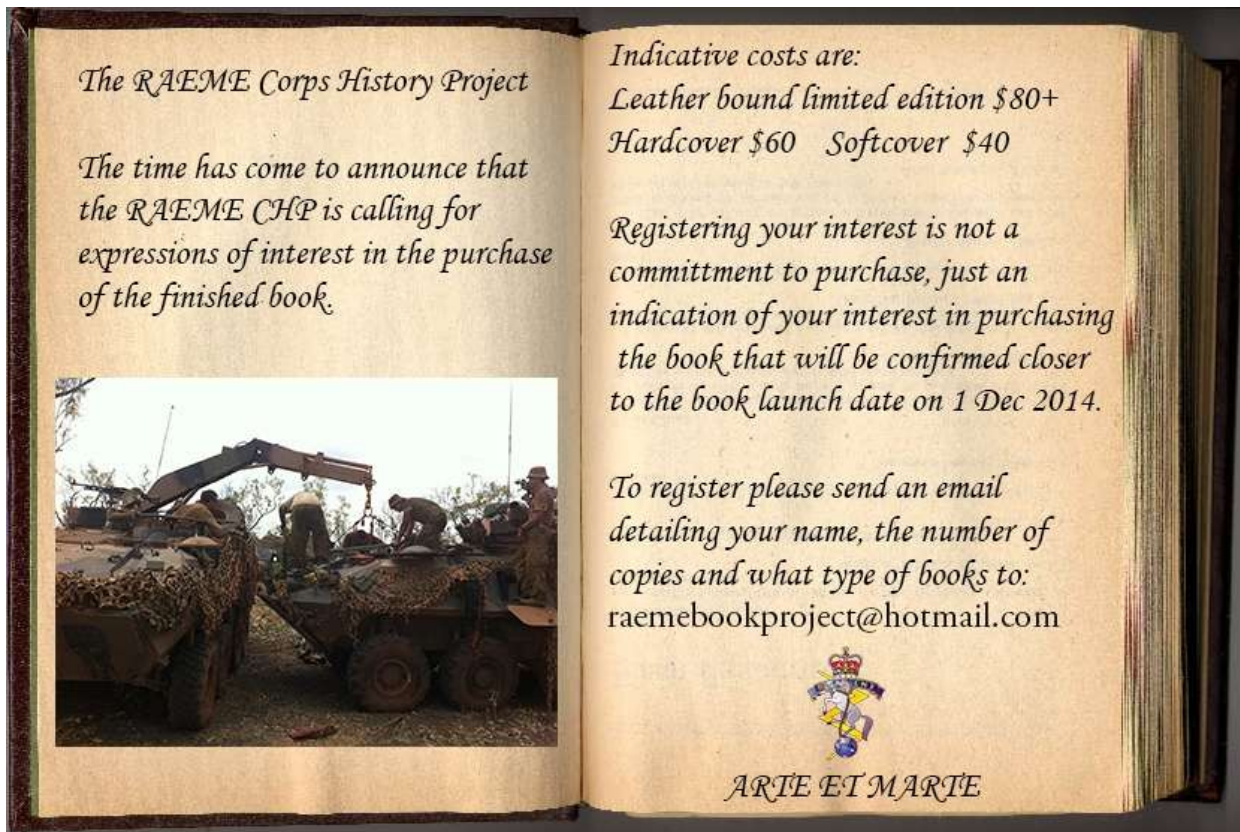

CORPS HISTORY BOOK UPDATE



CORPS HISTORY PROJECT PROGRESS REPORT from BRIG Ross Grant

I advised recently on the RAEME National Website, and in the last edition of the RAEME Association Queensland 'Spanner News' for 2014, that the final manuscript for the CHP book was with the publishers, and a number of our team were collaboratively completing the final editing process. I am happy to report the book was provided to the printers shortly thereafter.

As of 2 Apr 15, I have now been advised that two pallet loads of books have been despatched from China to Australia – the expected delivery date at the HOC Cell Bandiana is now around 30 Apr 15. Given this firm time-line, I have recommended to the HOC, BRIG Andrew Mathewson that the project team will continue:

- with the on-line sales process over the next few months, and subsequently encourage our community to continue purchasing the book on-line; and
- for his team to plan for the commencement of book distribution soon after the books are available at Bandiana/Bonegilla, in early May 2015.

Our other good news is that BRIG Mathewson, has negotiated, with assistance from COL Tom Reynolds the COL COMDT – NSW/ACT, for the national book launch to occur on 15 Jul 15 at the Australian War Memorial (AWM) in Canberra. This launch will include a number of activities, including the changing of the guard, a 'Last Post Ceremony', to celebrate the life of A RAEME soldier who died on active service, and a wreath-laying.

The Association ANZAC Day March co-ordinator will again be John Howard, look out for him and/or the Association Banner

The RAEME Vietnam Veteran's group march under their own banner and the group will be led by ADJ Lee again this year and they are looking for as many RAEME people as possible to march with them.

The route is the same as last year and Salutes (banners to be lowered on the "eyes right") are to be paid at the National War Memorial, the South African War Memorial on North Terrace and the Vice-Regal Saluting point on the Eastern side of King William Road near the Parade Ground at Torrens Training Depot.

Vehicles will be available for veterans who can no longer make the distance. Please let Don Harvy know (08) 7007 4470, mobile (0412 021 411) or email (harvy@adam.com.au) if you require a seat.

The vehicles will return passengers to Pulteney Street immediately after the marchers have been dismissed at the end of the March. The RSL is providing the vehicle(s) and they will form a "Pod" of vehicles within each group. This is to prevent marchers directly behind the veterans from being forced to breathe exhaust fumes.

Carers:

One carer or wheelchair pusher is permitted to assist a veteran within unit ranks. Wheelchairs to be in front row.

March Conduct and Paying of Compliments

Unit flags, banners and roundels are to be lowered for all salutes. Yellow unit identification signs are to remain upright and facing the front at the saluting points, except on approaching the Vice-Regal, where they are turned half-right for the salute on the order EYES-RIGHT and then returned to face the front on the order EYES-FRONT.

Free car parking

We have not been advised by the RSL of any free parking this year, but check the local papers closer to the day in case free parking is still available.
