
VALE - WO1 Daryl (Dutchy) HOLLAND



It is with regret that we advise the passing of WO1 Dutchy Holland on 19 April 2015.

Dutchy was a highly respected member of RAEME who was always prepared to go the "extra yard" to make sure things were done well.

He was a member of the AEME/RAEME Association of SA for over 30 years including 20 years on the committee and during that time he spent 10 years



as President. He was made an Honorary Life Member of the Association in 2003.

Dutchy started his military career as an Army Apprentice in the Vehicle Mechanic stream being part of the 9th Intake at Balcombe (Victoria). When he got out of the ARA he worked as a civilian in 41 Supply Battalion at Warradale looking after the pool vehicles.

Sometime later he joined the CMF (now called GRes) at 107 Infantry Field Workshops at Keswick and later at Warradale as ASM. From there he served in the Light Aid Detachments (LADs) of a number of the CMF units including 8 Transport Company (RACT), 3/9 South Australian Mounted Rifles (RAAC) and finished his career as ASM of 8 Transport Squadron.

Dutchy requested a private funeral and that all his "army mates" should have a drink "with him" next time they got together.

After a number of requests and suggestions from various RAEME Groups for a suitable get together to remember Dutchy our President MAJ Richard Moyses, with help from other GRes members, have organised a function in the combined Officers and SGTs Mess at Warradale Barracks on Saturday 27th June starting at 7.00pm.

<u>Update on LT Lionel Penley (ex WO2)</u>



June 30, 2015 marks the 50th Anniversary of the commencement of the second (1965-1072) Australian National Service Scheme.

Half a century ago, the first of the 63,735 young men called up for two years (later reduced to 18 months) service in the Regular Army marched into Recruit Training at Kapooka, Puckapunyal and later Singleton. Of these, 150 served in Borneo and 15,381 in Vietnam. 212 made the Ultimate Sacrifice.

The era was most significant in Australian military history with the war in Vietnam and the rapid escalation in the size of the Australian Army.

Although not part of their original life plan, most regarded their time in the Service favourably.

It is proper that this milestone be appropriately acknowledged. Accordingly, the National Servicemen's Association of Australia, in conjunction with the O.T.U. Association is planning a ceremony to pay the occasion the recognition it deserves.

A commemorative service is to be held at the National Service Memorial in Canberra, ACT at 1000 hours on June 30, 2015. It will take the form of a march from the National War Memorial to the site followed by the service itself.

There were also a large number of raffle prize winners with the prizes being well spread amongst those attending.


Any profit we make from the evening, including takings from the door, raffles, sale of merchandise etc is used in the running of our association. Bar trading profits go to the relevant mess we use.



Admiring her neighbour's garden, which had beautiful bright red organic tomatoes, she went one day and inquired of him his secret.


"It's really quite simple," the old man explained.
