IMPORTANT NOTICE

AUSTRALIA POST MAIL OUT OF NEWSLETTER TO CEASE

We have been very fortunate in the past that one of the unit commanders has allowed us to do our mail out photo copying on their unit photocopier. This coupled with bulk mail subsidies have made the mail out affordable to the Association. Unfortunately due to changes within this unit we are no longer able to do the copying and will have to go to a printing service e.g. Officeworks to get them printed.

Investigation shows this cost plus the postage makes the bulk mail out unaffordable for the Association so the plan is to move as many people as possible to the email mail out list. We appreciate that some people do not have computers and are therefore prepared to get copies printed professionally (Full Colour or Black and White) and it is proposed we charge those members requiring this service the cost of the printing. For those wishing to avail themselves of this option the proposed cost will be:

- Full Colour copy \$50 per annum (cost \$0.88 per page)
- Black and White \$10 per annum (cost \$0.10 per page)

This covers the 4 Newsletters a year and the AGM Notice

This proposal will be discussed at the AGM and this or another suitable outcome will be agreed upon.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

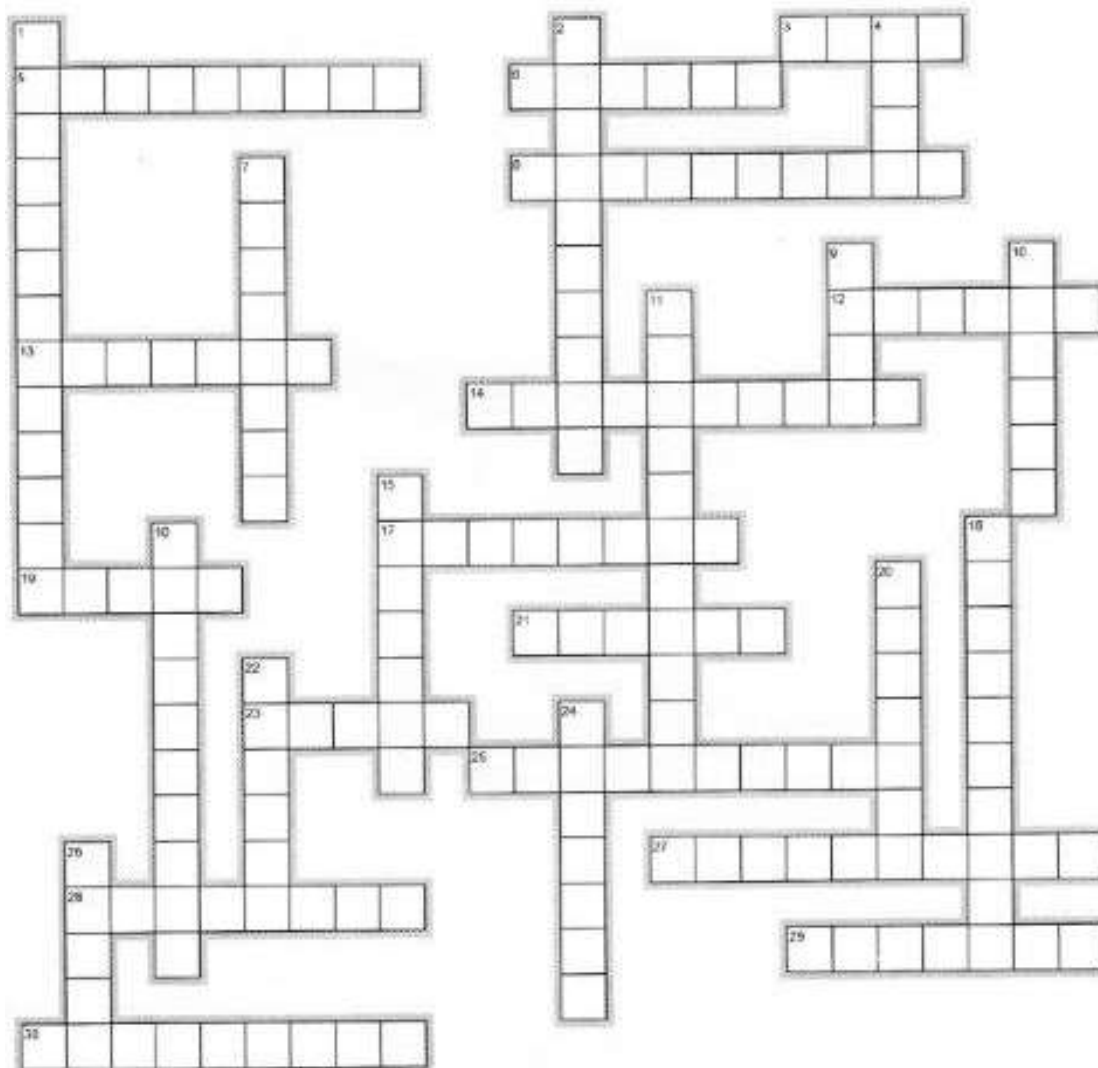

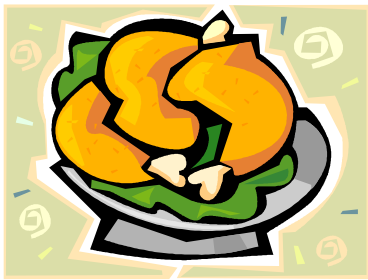

CRAFTSMEN 1942- 2014 - BOOK LAUNCH

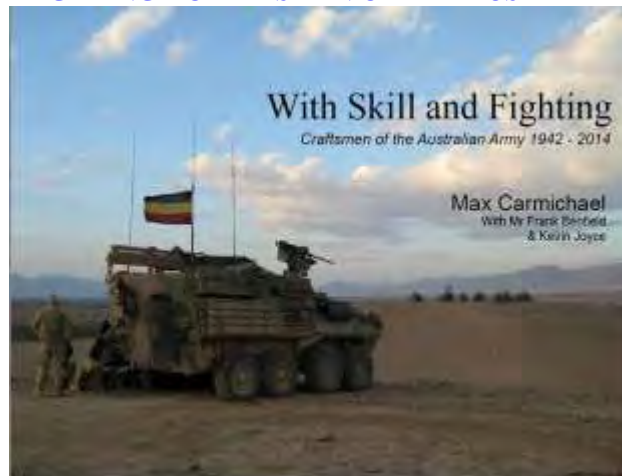
I am pleased to advise that the national launch of our memoir 'With Skill and Fighting – Craftsmen of the Australian Army 1942-2014', last week at the Australian War Memorial, was a very successful event. For those who weren't able to get there, the launch was preceded by the RAEME Corps Seminar, where a key topic, was the commencement of PLAN CENTAUR, a project to review the way RAEME conduct its business on the modern battle field as the Army introduces new equipment, but principally new armoured and protect vehicles.

For those who missed the launch, the speeches and opportunities for socialising, the organisation of the launch was a credit to the HOC Cell, the AWM staff and the generous efforts of KBR & Raytheon, facilitated by the COLCOMDT ACT/NSW, Tom Reynolds. Everything clicked into place, and it was a wonderful evening, regardless of whether you were participating, or a member of the audience of some 150 plus enjoying the hospitality provided. The launch was preceded by a Last Post Ceremony, at the AWM, which was not only well attended, but fittingly saw an address delivered by MAJ Ian Cook RAEME. Chief of Army made a most appropriate speech and told the gathered Bluebell's what he really thought of the Corps – most generous in his praise

"So be it, ribbit." Said the frog, this time accompanied by purple smoke.

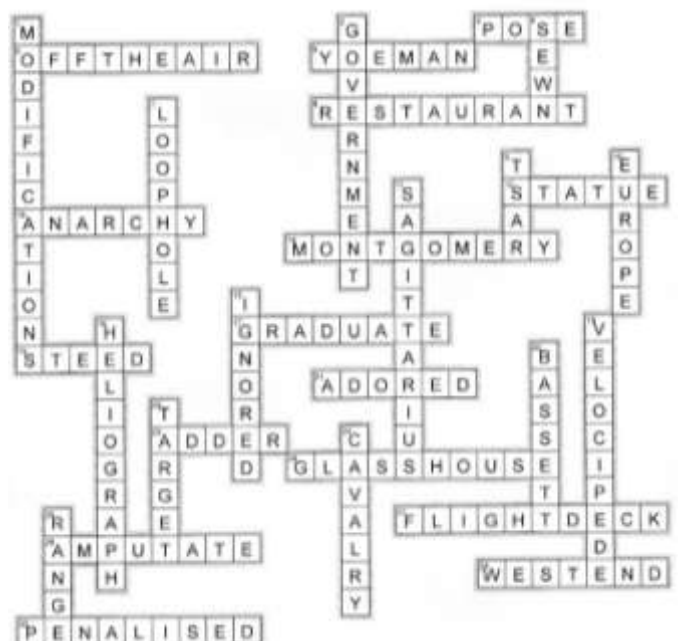
"I wish for a powerful motorcycle." Said the rabbit, who found himself astride a big Harley, chugging away beneath him.

ENTRANCE TO MILITARY BASES? RETIRED MEMBER IDENTITY CARD

The following email trail from a long standing member is included for general information.

From: Trevor Parrot
To: Army Contact
Subject: Puckapunyal access

I live in Adelaide and am currently travelling through Victoria.

Being a Vietnam veteran, when I saw a sign on the Hume Highway re the Vietnam Veteran's Wall, I diverted to see it, as friends had said how it was very well done. I was disappointed to be stopped at the Puckapunyal gate and turned away.

I understand the need for controlled access and changes to security status and do not have an issue with that. However, I do think it would do the Army well to give highway based advice that the base is closed to the public, thus saving travellers time and effort.

Security staff at the gates obviously have no control over these matters, but end up bearing the brunt of disappointed, hopeful visitors. It is unlikely that I will again have an opportunity to visit Puckapunyal to see this wall.

I felt let down.

How about having signage placed to alert travellers to current access restrictions? It could be done in similar fashion to road advice for snow or outback tracks with electronic control so that no-one need attend to change the signs.

Doing this would effectively avoid confrontation at the gate - something that was obviously happening before I got there. I was disappointed that the Army was unable to have a simple, effective basic means of communicating with the public that could easily avoid inconvenience and disappointment.

Dear Mr Parrott

Thank you for contacting the Australian Army.

I am sorry for the disappointment at being unable to access the base at Puckapunyal to visit the Vietnam Veteran's Wall. To avoid this situation in the future, you might like to consider applying for a **RETIRED MEMBER IDENTITY CARD**, which can be obtained through your nearest Pass Office.

To determine the location of his nearest pass office you can call the National Defence Switchboard on 1300 333 362 for advice.

I have also forwarded your email to the area that looks after facilities for consideration and reply in relation to your complaint about the sign on the Hume Highway.

1. This card does not apply to Spouses etc.
2. Trevor has advised that he has now found out the Vietnam Veteran's Wall is in Seymour not Puckapunyal, but this also applies to the RAAC Museum which is inside the Puckapunyal Base.
3. The **RETIRED MEMBER IDENTITY CARD** may also be useful for gaining entry to local barracks under Safe Base "CHARLEY" lock down conditions.
