

LAWYER vs INSURANCE COMPANY

A Charlotte, NC, lawyer purchased a box of very rare and expensive cigars, then insured them against fire among other things. Within a month, having smoked his entire stockpile of these great cigars and without yet having made even his first premium payment on the policy, the lawyer filed claim against the insurance company.

In his claim, the lawyer stated the cigars were lost "in a series of small fires." The insurance company refused to pay, citing the obvious reason: that the man had consumed the cigars in the normal fashion.

The lawyer sued...and won!

In delivering the ruling the judge agreed with the insurance company that the claim was frivolous. The Judge stated nevertheless, that the lawyer held a policy from the company in which it had warranted that the cigars were insurable and also guaranteed that it would insure them against fire, without defining what is considered to be unacceptable fire, and was obligated to pay the claim.

Rather than endure lengthy and costly appeal process, the insurance company accepted the ruling and paid \$15,000 to the lawyer for his loss of the rare cigars lost in the "fires."

NOW FOR THE BEST PART...

After the lawyer cashed the cheque, the insurance company had him arrested on 24 counts of ARSON!!!! With his own insurance claim and testimony from the previous case being used against him, the lawyer was convicted of intentionally burning his insured property and was sentenced to 24 months in jail and a \$24,000 fine.

This is a true story and was the 1st place winner in the recent Criminal Lawyers Award Contest.



ARMY MUSEUM OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA

New Vietnam Display Opening

On Wednesday 12 October a new interactive – Vietnam display: Aeromedical Evacuation - was officially launched in Gallery Three of the Australian Army Museum of South Australia based at Keswick Barracks, and is perhaps the most inventive to date, representing the artistic and computer skills of their volunteers.

After introductions by Brigadier Nick Williams representing the AMOSA board, the official opening was performed by Colonel Peter Scott DSO (former Commanding Officer of 3RAR). The display consists of a mural of a helicopter painted high on a back wall, the skilled work of South Australian artist, art teacher and theatre set designer Brian Budgen. It represents a



familiar M.A.S.H. like scene in both wars in Korea and Vietnam, when injured military personnel were airlifted by being strapped into a flat rescue basket and hoisted by crane into the helicopter.

In his speech, Colonel Scott reminded us that aeromedical evacuation with a helicopter using the now familiar 'Stokes' litter (named after its inventor Charles Francis Stokes, retired Surgeon General of the US navy) is commonplace in both war and peacetime but it was first used in Korea 65 years ago. Two Vietnam Veterans Edward Czerwinski and Trevor Sharland were then asked to recount their memories of being rescued in this manner, with dramatic stories of swinging perilously beneath the helicopter narrowly missing flying bullets.

The formalities were complete when Colonel Scott pressed the appropriate button on the interactive and the litter containing the wounded 'mannequin' was hoisted realistically up towards the metal arm projected from the painted helicopter, to the sound of whirring rotary blades. The re-enactment was met with much enthusiasm by the gathered crowd and many spent time examining the display, which includes a diorama of the Battle of Long Tan as well as trying out the other buttons on the interactive control panel. The photos and film clips caused much discussion and reminiscence which continued during the special morning tea that followed the opening.

Vietnam: Aeromedical Evacuation is another in a series of interactive tableaux at the museum including Watson's Pier during the WW1 Gallipoli campaign, the WW1 trenches of Amiens on the Western Front, and the desert sands of El Alamein during WW2.

The Army Museum is located at Keswick Barracks and is just inside Gate 4 off Anzac Highway and is open every Sunday from 12 noon - 4 pm or by appointment Mondays and Wednesdays.









The 2017 Museum focus will be on Light Horse Operations in World War 1

Every night the maintenance man would remove them and the next day the girls would put them back


Finally the principal decided that something had to be done.
