FAREWELL ON YOUR RETIREMENT - MAJ Doug Gammon OAM

It gives me much pleasure to write a few words as a tribute to the longest serving member of the Corps and Corps Icon MAJ Doug Gammon, in recognition of his most inestimable contribution. Doug predates just about all personnel, weapons and equipment currently in service in the Australian Army. Doug is known to pretty much every member of the Corps one way or another. Be it from his 26 years as a tradesman and artificer in the fitter armament stream, his 6 years as an officer in the ARA, his 8 years as a PT member or his dedicated work as editor of the Corps journal and Corps heritage custodian. During the past 5 years Doug has made a most valuable contribution to the preservation of Corps heritage, Corps contribution to the Bandiana Army Museum, the Corps Craftsman Memorial, and has done an outstanding job as editor of the RAEME Craftsman magazine.

Doug joined the Army as a 16th class Army Apprentice in 1961. During his time at Balcombe he was joined by such Corps notables as Apprentice R.L.G Grant (to become BRIG Grant AM, DEME), Apprentice John "Jack" Lord (MAJ Lord 1961-2001), Apprentice Kearsley (COL Kearsley AM), Apprentice Harry Percival (MAJ Percival). Doug's record-of-service reads like a short story and I can say from first hand experience his fireside yarns of his experiences would make for a box office mini series, albeit suitable for restricted audience only.

Doug served in Vietnam in 1971 with 12 FD REGT LAD mainly working in Fire Support Bases maintaining the 105 mm M2A2 guns. Doug was awarded an OAM in 1984 in recognition of his outstanding service to Army Apprentice training at 1 Base Workshop Battalion.

The old adage "behind every good man is the support of a good woman" (in this case women) is certainly true for Doug. Doug's wife Joyce and daughters Stacey and Kelly have been a pillar of support to him and not withstanding the challenges life throws at raising a family, Doug has been equally blessed in his domestic life as he has in his service life. Between them Doug and Joyce have raised two charming daughters, one of whom has recently provided Doug his first grandchild, and apple of his eye, Zoe.

There is no doubt MAJ Doug Gammon will be sorely missed by the Corps. The legacy of his Corps Spirit, his dedication to the Corps and his irrepressible energy will remain long after he has hooked up the caravan and circumnavigated this large continent of ours, as is his want.

Doug, on behalf of all the members of the Corps I wish you and Joyce all the very best for your retirement, and if you can secure a leave pass from your grandparent duties we wish you all the best for your travels.

Her Excellency Marjorie Jackson-Nelson AC, CVO, MBE, Governor of South Australia, attended. Afterwards the Governor inspected the Reserve Forces Recruiting displays on the Torrens Parade Ground.

July weather can be a bit hit and miss. Unlike last year where there was warm sunshine, it was overcast and foggy, but at least it did not rain, although there was a "lazy wind" blowing from the north. There appeared to be about 200 people in attendance. Association members I ran into included Brian Holmes, John Howard and Greg Rosser.

Moving the Celebration from 1 July to the first Sunday in July means that more serving and exserving people could attend because it is not a working day.

NAVAL GUNS AT FORT LARGS (RESTORATION PROJECT)

John Howard and I attended a Work Party on 4 May and greased and exercised the Guns.

We had an extra work party on 6 July to remove the top plate from the northern Gun to inspect and clean the ball-bearings and race. Fortunately Grant Kuchel was able to borrow a portapower kit from a mate and he also brought a digital camera with him. With some of our ugly mugs it was a wonder we didn't break it for him.

The top plate came off with some difficulty. Just once it would be nice to have a task that is straight forward and presents no problems. The securing bolt heads, most likely from the build up of paint and old burrs, were slightly too large for the ¾ inch square drive sockets. The socket

fitted the other Gun OK but some filing on the flats of the bolts and the flats of an OE spanner so it fitted enabled the bolts to be removed eventually. As this Gun will traverse under the handwheel (after an initial push on the barrel to "break the seal") it was rather surprising to discover that the ball-bearings were in a worse state than the southern Gun. They were all corroded as expected but one was in several pieces and a few of them had well developed flat spots. We cleaned out the race of most of the dried grease and filled it with a oil/dieso mixture which we hope will help to lift the scale at our next Work Party on 3 August.

My thanks to the usual crew of Mike Culley, John Howard, Graham Janz, Lindsay Johnson and Peter Schumann, and to Grant for twisting the arm of a mate for the porta-power and as photographer extraordinaire - well I might need some more photos later!! Keith Tainsh
