# **2008 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING REPORT**

The 2008 Annual General Meeting was held on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> December in the Warradale Barracks OR's Canteen.

Key items covered include:

**AEME/RAEME of SA Website** - The website has been developed and can now be accessed. Work on the website is still in progress with more information to be added. The website is very well presented.

**RAEME Corps Port** - There has been problems with the bottling and labelling so the port has not been delivered, but it will be available in the new year. See Grant Kuchel to purchase a bottle at \$20 each.

**Association Banner** – The change of name required on the banner has been completed ( SA DIV removed and replaced with SA INC). It was also proposed that holes / wind openings be added to help banner bearers hold the banner on windy days. Committee to implement proposal.

**2009 ANZAC Function** - Decisions will be made regarding this function at the first committee meeting in 2008. Based on 9 CSSB's current training program the function may be held on the evening of Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> April. This is subject to final confirmation and agreement of CO 9 CSSB . Information will be passed on to members when the date has been confirmed. The function will be based on the same format as previous ANZAC functions.

Information regarding the function is required at RSL by 1<sup>st</sup> February.

**2009 ANZAC Day Activities** – It was decided that the COLCOMDT should lead the march in lieu of WO2 Grant Kuchel who will be unavailable. Unit guides will also be required and will need to attend the meeting with the RSL. John Howard, Bob Killoran and David Turner volunteered to be guides. It is proposed to seek approval for the two "Soldiers of the Year" for 2008 to carry the banner.

**2009 Officers, WOs and SNCOs Formal Dinner** - The date is to be confirmed as soon as possible. It was recommended that it be held at the Sergeant's Mess at Woodside Barracks again in 2009.

**2009 RAEME Birthday All Ranks Family Function** - This will have a similar format to the 2008 function. At this stage planning is centred on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> December, but still to be confirmed.

**Committee Proposal** - "Existing members over the age of 75 have the option of not paying fees, but are still entitled to remain members and receive the Newsletter and attend Association function at the prescribed cost." A vote of thanks was also given to Robin Maslen's in recognition of his wonderful efforts in support of the association and condolences were extended to his wife Val.

**Honorary Life Membership was granted to WO2 Grant Kuchel.** He was presented with a life membership Certificate and nametag, Flowers were presented to his wife Christine.

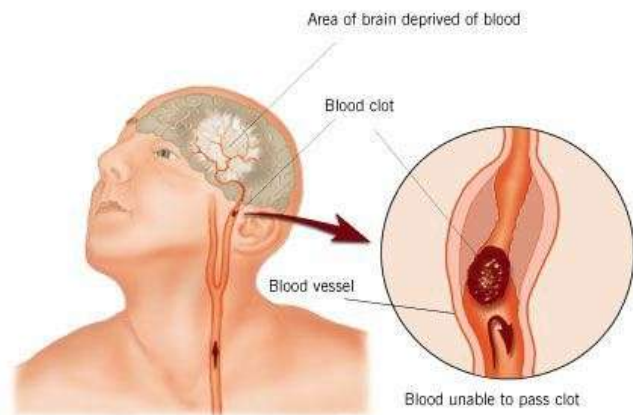
## STROKE IDENTIFICATION

In memory of Rob Guest (The Phantom of the Opera) who died of a massive stroke.

**STROKE: Remember  
The 1st Three Letters....S.T.R.**

A nurse downloaded this information and encourages everyone to spread the word.

If everyone can remember something this simple, it could save a life.



Typical Story – At a BBQ, a friend stumbled and took a little fall - she assured everyone that she was fine (they offered to call an ambulance) .....she said she had just tripped over a brick because of her new shoes. They got her cleaned up and got her a new plate of food. While she appeared a bit shaken up, she went about enjoying herself the rest of the evening.

Her husband called later telling everyone that his wife had been taken to the hospital - (at 6:00 pm she passed away.) She had suffered a stroke at the BBQ. Had they known how to identify the signs of a stroke, perhaps she would be with us today. Some don't die.... they end up in a helpless, hopeless condition instead.

A neurologist says that if he can get to a stroke victim within 3 hours he can totally reverse the effects of a stroke...totally. He said the trick was getting a stroke recognized, diagnosed, and then getting the patient medically cared for within 3 hours, which is tough.

## RECOGNIZING A STROKE

**Remember the '3' steps, S-T-R    Read and Learn!**

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke.

Doctors say a bystander can generally recognise a stroke by asking three simple questions:

**S - Ask the individual to SMILE.**

**T - Ask the person to TALK and SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE (Coherently)**  
(i.e. It is sunny out today)

**R - Ask him or her to RAISE BOTH ARMS.**

**NOTE: The University of California have circulated an additional 'sign' of a stroke: Ask the person to 'stick' out their tongue. If the tongue is 'crooked', if it goes to one side or the other, that is also an indication of a stroke.**

If he or she has trouble with ANY ONE of these tasks, call 000 immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher.

**Warning It can be extremely dangerous to reach the conclusion that a person DOES NOT require medical attention just because they can successfully carry out the three steps outlined in the test. IF IN DOUBT CALL 000 as time is critical.**
