## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

#### **COLONEL COMMANDANT'S UPDATE**

Hello Everyone

My wife and I have recently returned from a 3 week visit to Vietnam and Cambodia and we found it very interesting. During my period of full time duty I was unlucky (or lucky?) not to be posted to Vietnam and have always wanted to go and see what it was like, particularly before it fully became a giant tourist resort.

From my observations, the North has lots of picturesque areas, but Hanoi has not advanced as much as the major cities in the South. Da Nang (central Vietnam) was a really interesting with the beach area being set up as the Gold Coast of Vietnam, lots of beach front apartments, golf courses, new town layout, wide streets with easy access to airport and other tourist areas

Ho Chi Min City is also spreading both side of the Mekong River with new expressways and road works a common occurrence. Like most of Asia, totally motor bike /scooter crazy. While we were there we took the opportunity to visit the "Long Tan" memorial and we were fortunate to have a local guide who had a good knowledge of the battle (from both points of view) and he organised long stem roses to place on the memorial and a service to pay respect to those Australians who died in the battle. A very moving experience.

We then went to Nui Dat, the site of the main Australian Fire Base, which is now a small town which uses the base runway as its main street. He also showed us tunnels which were dug to within 1 km of the base perimeter.

For those of you who haven't been to Vietnam, it is a very interesting place to visit and we recommend coupling it with a trip to Seam Reap (Cambodia) to see the Temple Ruins at Angkor Wat and Angkor Tom.

The "President's Report" provides a rundown on progress with the new National Association so I will not discuss it further.

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
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# 2011 ANNUAL CENTRAL REGION RAEME OFFICERS, WOS & SNCOS FORMAL DINING-IN NIGHT

# ANZAC DAY 2011 MARCH REPORT

This year saw a continuation of the big reorganisation of the Anzac Day Parade with major changes to the arrangements for all World War 2 units and subsequent changes to the remainder of the marchers. The aim was to focus the attention of the march on to those remaining WW 2 veterans who were able to participate and to shorten the distance they had to march.

For the RAEME group(s) there was an additional variation this year with Frank Owen (with agreement from the AEME/ RAEME Association of SA) organising a separate Vietnam RAEME Group. This had the advantage of allowing RAEME veterans who, in the past, had been marching with the unit in which they served to march under the RAEME banner.



The Vietnam RAEME Group was lead by MAJ (Adj) Lee with approximately 30 in the ranks. A great effort Frank and hopefully it will be a bigger group next year once more of our RAEME brethren get to know about the new group.

The RAEME WW 2 veterans group continues to get smaller each year with most attending being confined to travelling in Land Rovers or buses. It is believed only two WW 2 RAEME veterans participated and they were included with the WW 2 Logistic Group and our RAEME roundel was paraded at the front of the group.



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
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
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# 2011 RAEME MIXED ANZAC FUNCTION

That leaves just two people to do the work.






