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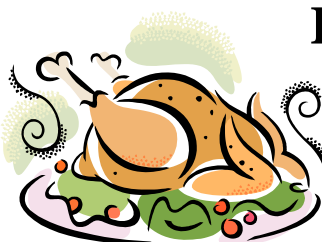

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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Well here we are well past the half way mark of another year and there seems to be little we can do to slow down how quickly the weeks go by.

Over the past few months there has been productive progress with the ongoing structure and strategy of the National Association, now to be known as the RAEME Association. The President, Ray Norman is keeping us, along with all state based (regional) associations up to date of proposals and topics to be refined and decided as the association matures.

I am trying to locate anyone who served with Vietnam veteran BEVIS LABBETT GARDNER (Service No. 216988 and served with RAEME 102 Fd Wksp SVN 1968/69) who died in 1994. He was known by colleagues as JOHN GARDNER during his military service.

Some additional details; Enlisted in Sydney on 27 June 1966 and discharged on 26 June 1972...apparently actual date released was 20 July 1972. Bevis died 20 July 1994.

His son Ben who resides in Tasmania is keen to talk to anyone who served with his father.

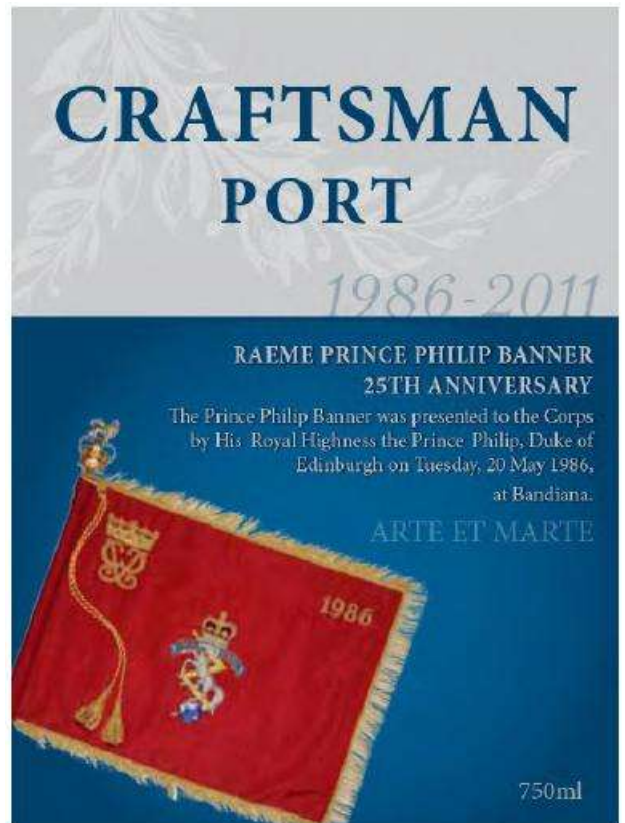

Defence Reserve Association National Conference

Keswick Barracks - 20 Aug 2011

As advised at our AGM and through this Newsletter your association has, along with a number of other corps and unit associations, become an associate member of Defence Reserve Association of South Australia (DRASA). This gives our association and its members a forum to voice their thoughts and issues (where relevant) to the senior members of the Australian Defence Force.

Adelaide was the location of the Defence Reserves Association 2011 National Conference which was held on Saturday 20 August at Keswick Barracks and the theme of the conference was: **ADF Reserves Capability Where to now?**

Holding the conference in Adelaide was considered by our local DRASA committee as a once off opportunity to show the national committee how well things are done in SA. Surprise! Surprise! They thought it all went off so well they plan to hold it in Adelaide again next year.

While the Association was originally established to represent the defence reserves, because of the quality of its membership (includes a number of senior ranking ex regular defence force and reserve officers and civilians) its views are widely respected and listened to. Because of this the conference attracts a number of parliamentarians and senior defence force speakers and other guests who present the latest proposals and possible future ideas for consideration by the committee.

Some recent major outcomes for DRA are their objections to the force/unit reductions proposed in the Army Future Force project. This project has been shelved and it was noted by MAJGEN Caligari during his speech to have been an "ill-conceived" idea. They are now reviewing the probable outcomes of Project BEERSHEBA.

The 2011 Conference was addressed by a panel of distinguished speakers:

- International keynote speaker: RADM Jennifer Bennet Chief Reserves and Cadets (Canada) who discussed the Canadian Reserves
- Senator David Feeney Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Defence who presented the Government's position - *Senator Feeney was extremely generous in his perspective of the Reserves and appears to be committed to maintaining the Reserve Forces.*
- Stuart Robert - Shadow Minister for Defence who presented the Oppositions position
- MAJGEN Paul Brereton, Head CRESA, along with his staff, presented Situation Reports
 - CDRE Richard Phillips - DG Res Navy
 - BRIG Iain Spence - DG Res Army
 - AIRCDRE Terry Delahunty - DG Res Air Force
 - AIRCDRE Hugh Bartholomeusz - Defence Health Services
- MAJGEN John Caligari - Head Modernisation & Strategic Plans, described Project Beersheba - the Army Force modernisation Review
- Mr. Jerome Reid - Director Reserve Planning Stream, SRP, described Project Suakin
- MAJGEN Greg Garde reviewed the current situation of Employer Support and Protection
- CAPT Joe Lukaitis RANR, presented a paper entitled: "The Navy Reserve Today - Overview and Challenges"
- CDRE Richard Phillips - DG Res Navy, discussed The Navy Reserve in the future Navy
- MAJGEN Paul Irving presented a paper entitled: "The Army Reserve - its Potential"

In the evening a formal Dinner was conducted at which the guest speaker was Chief of Air Force AIRMSHL Geoff Brown. The meal was subsidised by Transfield Services and the wines were donated by Shingleback Wines (of McLaren Vale).

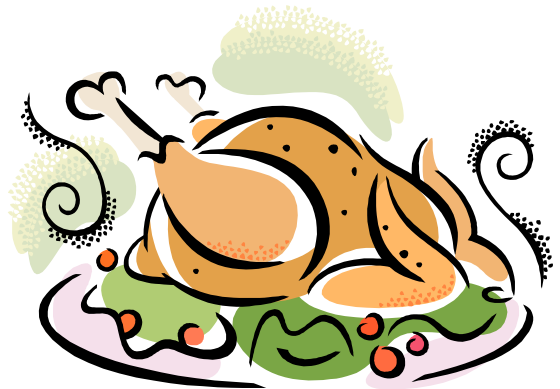
