RAEME/RAEME ASSOCIATION - GROUP 12(A) assembled on the northern side of Grenfell Street, east of Pulteney Street.



The Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) will co-ordinate the fourth annual Veterans' Health Week (VHW) between Monday 22 and Sunday 28 October 2012. VHW aims to raise awareness of, and encourage participation in, activities that promote and maintain the health and wellbeing of veterans, their families and carers.

The Minister for Veterans' Affairs, the Hon. Warren Snowdon MP, has endorsed this year's theme of *"Social Inclusion - Participate, Connect and Influence"*.

A number of events will be organised across Australia throughout the week that will focus on enhancing social inclusion for veterans. DVA recognises that working together with ex-service organisations can help overcome barriers to social inclusion for individuals and the community.

The key messages for VHW 2012 promote action for social inclusion

- **Participate** by learning something new through employment, volunteer work or education and training.
- **Connect** by linking in to local community resources and engaging with people and family.
- **Influence** by having a voice, influencing decisions that affect you and speaking up for those who can't for themselves.

The strength of the veteran community lies with its members and their social connections and my purpose in writing to you is to invite your members to take part in this major health promotion initiative.

This year in particular, DVA is calling on the veteran community to consider how they can involve others who they think would benefit from reconnecting and feeling included and ask everyone to encourage other veterans to get behind this great initiative by attending and supporting the activities that are planned, or to organise VHW events.

DVA's Veterans' Access Network offices are responsible for working with ex-service organisations to assist in planning and coordinating events in metropolitan and regional areas and will be in touch to promote and help organise local events.

VHW also provides an opportunity for you to promote and highlight any ex-service organisation activities within your local community.

Up-to-date information about VHW will be available through a variety of channels such as the VHW website at www.dva.gov.au/vhw.htm as well as *Vetaffairs* and other newsletters.

If you would like to take up this opportunity by attending or planning an event for VHW 2012, we would like to hear from you. A very limited amount of funding may be available to assist you.
