





THE LAST M113 AS4 OFF THE PRODUCTION LINE

Vehicle Number 206717

About mid July, I received a phone call from Ron Rule an ex-National Serviceman who was called up and served with 3 Cavalry Regiment in Vietnam as a driver. The reason for Ron's call was, he'd been invited to drive, symbolically, the last up-graded M113 vehicle from the BAE Systems Australia production line at Wingfield in South Australia and was looking for someone who had crew commanded an APC in Vietnam.

I explained that I had been NCO i/c of a Forward Repair Team at 106 Field Workshop in Vietnam and had crew commanded a Fitters Vehicle during my time in that unit. That satisfied him and he suggested I contact Justin Brown who was the Production Manager at BAE Systems at Wingfield.



Justin arranged for Ron and me to attend a short driving course with the upgraded vehicle on Wednesday 25 July. The day was a great success but what a surprise to get into the driver's seat and find

so many changes. I even managed to climb up the side of the vehicle and enter the driving compartment from the top, ONCE

For those who are not aware, BAE Systems Australia was awarded a contract to upgrade the M113 A1 fleet, which included:

- Stretching the hull by about 600 mm;
- Adding an extra pair of road wheels;
- Replacing the power pack with a V6 4 stroke diesel;
- Improving the steering and braking capability; and
- To the APC variant, installing a powered traverse and elevation/depression turret.

There are seven M113 AS4 variants in the fleet:

- Basic Armoured Personnel Carrier (APC);
- Fitters, replace the Hyab knuckle crane with a Hyab telescopic;
- Recovery; Installation of a winch
- Ambulance:
- Command, lowered profile;
- Mortar; and
- Support, cut off behind the driver/crew commander and platform to carry a specialist container.

To begin with, in the driver's compartment, gone were the lateral steering levers and pivot turn levers. In their place were;

- steering yoke;
- brake pedal;
- Increased gear range control with dedicated pivot turn position and two reverse gears. and

• The vehicle is no longer amphibious.



The engine is much quieter than the original V6 53 2 stroke Detroit diesel, the steering control differential function has been incorporated into the transmission, the braking and pivot steering systems are much more positive and efficient and 1.5 hours will see the power pack removed and placed on its stand for repair work and servicing with another 1.5 hours to re-installed it and have it running. The cooling system is integral with the power pack.

As to driving, the vehicle is much more responsive to steering and braking and it has a a higher speed capability; all in all, much better to drive with a few new procedures which need to be followed during 'start up' and 'close down'.

The symbolic 'roll-out' of the last vehicle from the production line took place on Thursday, 2 August 2012, there were around 200 invited guests and staff, including members of the Royal Australian Armoured Corps (RAAC) Association. Following a few short presentations which illustrated the work that had been undertaken and to introduce Ron and me. We were ready to 'mount up' and drive off in the mortar variant.

The requirement was: Ramp up and secure, driver advance (under guide), drive from the workshop, proceed approximately 50 metres along the concrete parking area, pivot turn to face the way we'd just come, return to the workshop, pivot turn, lower the ramp and close down.

This was followed by a light luncheon and chat to anyone who wanted to do so. One former RAAC (presumably ex 3 Cav. Regt) member was quite peeved that an ex-RAEME representative had been selected to act as crew commander. I did try not to be too smug while talking to him but I figure that you don't get offers like that very often and certainly didn't volunteer to change places with him. Ron assured me he had contacted a number of organisations, including the VVAA, all to no avail and decided to try the RSL. It seems I was the only person anyone could think of that was known to have been involved with the M113A1. Who am I to argue?

For the 'inconvenience' caused, Justin presented each of us with a .50 calibre machine gun round that had been reconfigured into a highly polished bottle opener and, prior to leaving a beautifully mounted 3D image of an APC M113 AS4 enclosed in a resin cube,

My thanks to Ron Rule for putting me in touch with Justin. Our thanks to Justin, Tim, Geoff and all other staff members who made it such a great experience, one that I will remember for many years.

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
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
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Defence Reserve Association National Conference

Keswick Barracks - 28 July 2012

As advised at our AGM and through this Newsletter your association has, along with a number of other corps and unit associations, become an associate member of Defence Reserve Association of South Australia (DRASA). This gives our association and its members a forum to voice their thoughts and issues (where relevant) to the senior members of the Australian Defence Force. The COLCOMDT represented the Association at the Conference.

Because of the success of the 2011 conference Adelaide was again selected as the location of the Defence Reserves Association 2012 National Conference which was held on Saturday 28 July at Keswick Barracks and the theme of the conference was: **ADF Reserves - Maintaining Momentum in Testing times**

While the Association was originally established to represent the defence reserves, because of the quality of its membership (includes a number of senior ranking ex regular defence force and reserve officers and civilians) its views are widely respected and listened to. Because of this the conference attracts a number of parliamentarians and senior defence force speakers and other guests who present the latest proposals and possible future ideas for consideration by the committee.

Some recent major outcomes for DRA are their objections to the force/unit reductions proposed in the Army Future Force project. This project has been shelved and key aspects have now been incorporated into Projects BEERSHEBA and SUAKIN.

The 2012 Conference was addressed by a panel of distinguished speakers:


- Senator David Feeney, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Defence who gave an overview of the Government's position on defence

In the evening a formal Dinner was conducted at which the guest speaker was MAJGEN Jeff Sengelman.



Corps History Project (CHP).



The Corps History Project (CHP) has made significant progress in the last three months culminating in a meeting of the project teams from Victoria and Queensland on Saturday 15 Sep 12 at Enoggera's Blamey Barracks, courtesy of 20 STA Regt, and MAJ Keirin Joyce, to discuss progress and re-align our work effort as a team.

While the intent of the project still remains to celebrate the achievements of individuals, sub-units and units of RAEME Corps during warlike, non-warlike operations and peacetime training activities, a number of changes have been made to our approach to gathering articles and photographs for the book.

As you know, the project team have been encouraging members of the Corps, both past and present, to write articles and contribute photographs.

However because many are reticent, the decision has been taken to assist some contributors, simplify the submission process and ramp up the publicity. The CHP Book will also be officially launched at the 70th Anniversary Luncheon on 1 Dec 12, in Brisbane; and at the Corps Dinner at the RAEME Aircraft Maintenance School, on 30 Nov 12. In addition, the meeting will recommend to the HOC, the use of additional resources to undertake targeted interviews of individuals as part of an oral history initiative.

Given the other important aspect of the project is to capture and record stories that have underpinned and enhanced the reputation of RAEME over the past 70 years, and ensure they are recorded in perpetuity, it was also decided to facilitate the following initiatives:

- Continue to support the current development of a RAEME National Association website with the help of two members of the Corps providing the grunt and expertise. In time, this more complete website will link all other "RAEME" websites including the RAEME Face Book. This will be a major step forward, but in the interim, go to www.raeme.org.au and click on the Facebook banner for details of how to get your stories to the project team.
- Continue to support the CHP face book site, in particular for the younger members of the Corps, and enhance the promotional work with more simple messages. Remember the email address for contributions is raemebookproject@hotmail.com.
- Focus the author in the early stages of the project on writing the opening chapter about the history of the Corps up to the Vietnam campaign, while concurrently editing individual contributions as they are submitted.
- Continue evolving the "straw man" tabled at the meeting, which is based on the "Army in Profile" publication. The meeting were delighted with the

- format proposed and believe it is a very sound way to develop the final "coffee table" book.
- Finalise a production and publishing schedule for the book, which sees the official launch being on or around the various RAEME Birthdays events across Australia, with a deadline for all individual articles and photographs being 1 Apr 13. It is our intention to publish the book to coincide with RAEME Birthday celebration 1 Dec 13.
- Undertake a "self-publishing" exercise and manage the distribution along the same lines as the Annual Corps Port program coordinated by the RAEME HOC Cell and using the RAEME
- Regional representatives to get the book to those who purchased a copy.
- Undertake an exercise to obtain funding from private and corporate donors to offset the costs of writing and publishing the book and keep the cost of the book down. It is hoped that the RAEME National Association may assist in this regard.
- Increase the promotional activities over the next six months including a feature article about the CHP in the next issue of the "Craftsman" magazine to tie in with the 20th Anniversary of the publication of the "Craftsman" and the HOC writing to all RAEME Regional Reps seeking their support for contributions.
- Investigate the ability to undertake the collection of oral histories, and converting these histories into stories for the book, by seeking funding from the AWM and Dept of VA.
- Seek suitable photographs or artwork that could be used on the front cover of the book - it was agreed that ideally a new contemporary scene of RAEME in action like the Vietnam era operational scene, would be a good selling point.
- Action is underway via the CHP Promotions Team to elicit suitable photos from Corps members who have been on operations – see more below.
- Finally, the team will target some members of the Corps who have been involved in particular operations or activities which have built the reputation of the Corps in Recent years and seek their contributions.

A number of other initiatives were agreed to but critically we ask our readers to remember you all have a stake in this book and we want your stories and photos - any stories. If you have a story, with good supporting photos, then send them to
