- Discharged Jan 1999


He is currently working for the Army on a 5 year contract (DA50) reviewing and upgrading workshop and warehouse facilities around Australia (DLTP)

The vehicles will return passengers to Pulteney Street immediately after the marchers have been dismissed at the end of the March. <u>The RSL is</u> <u>providing the vehicle(s) and they will form a</u> <u>"Pod" of vehicles within each group</u>. This is to prevent marchers directly behind the veterans from being forced to breathe exhaust fumes.

One carer or wheelchair pusher is permitted to assist a veteran within unit ranks. Wheelchairs to be in front row.

#### March Conduct and Paying of Compliments

Unit flags, banners and roundels are to be lowered for all salutes. Yellow unit identification signs are to remain upright and facing the front at the saluting points, except on approaching the Official Dais, where they are turned half-right for the salute on the order EYES-RIGHT and then returned to face the front on the order EYES-FRONT.


