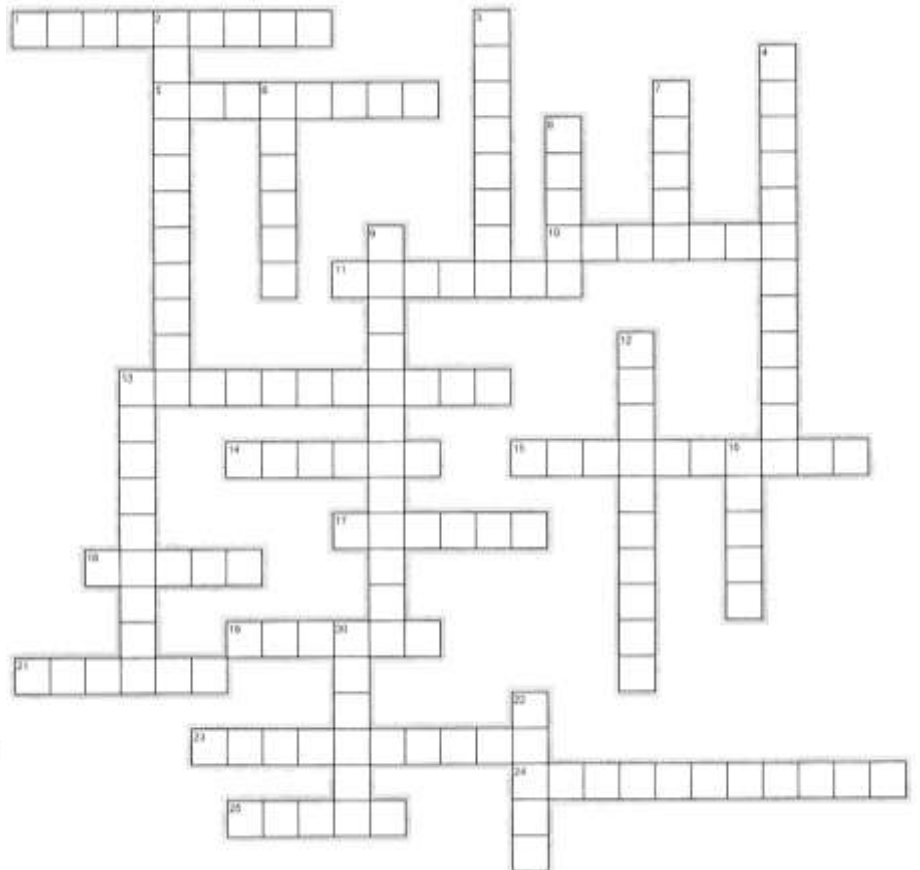

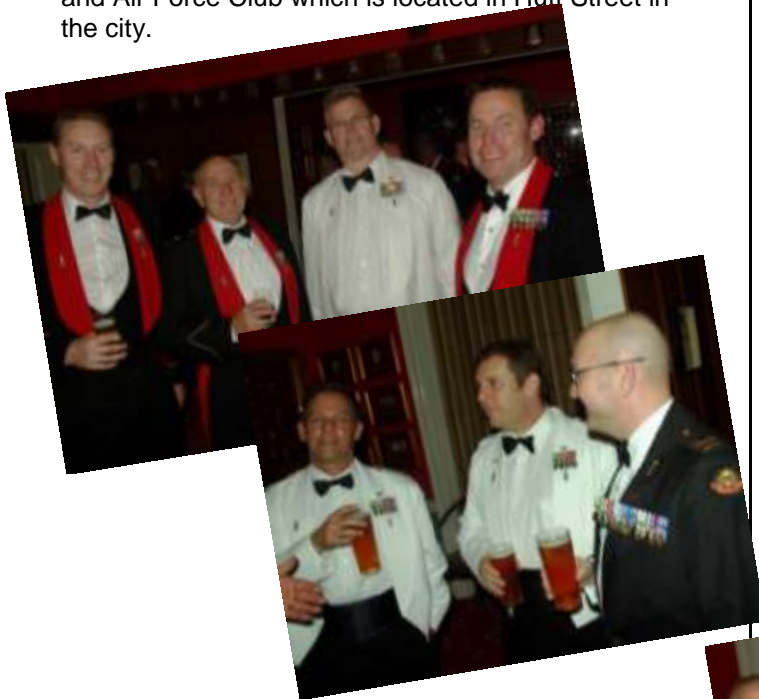

FORT LARGS GUNS UPDATE



It is a number of years since a work group of Association members (including Geoff Parker, John Howard, Mike Culley, John Fuller and Bob Matthews) completed the "Restoration" of the guns at Fort Largs. When they had finished, the mechanisms all worked (except firing of course) and the guns were left well greased .

Geoff Parker, one of our committee members thought that because of the imminent change of ownership of the site it was about time we checked on the guns again. Using his contacts in the SA Police Force he was able to contact the person currently responsible for access to the fort. A group of the original maintenance team members visited the site and although some of the more exposed mechanisms were again inoperable most of the gun mechanisms were in a reasonable state of repair. Last visit the team spent time greasing and fixing the working parts (see pictures) and it is proposed to return again shortly to try and free the seized (exposed) operating mechanisms.

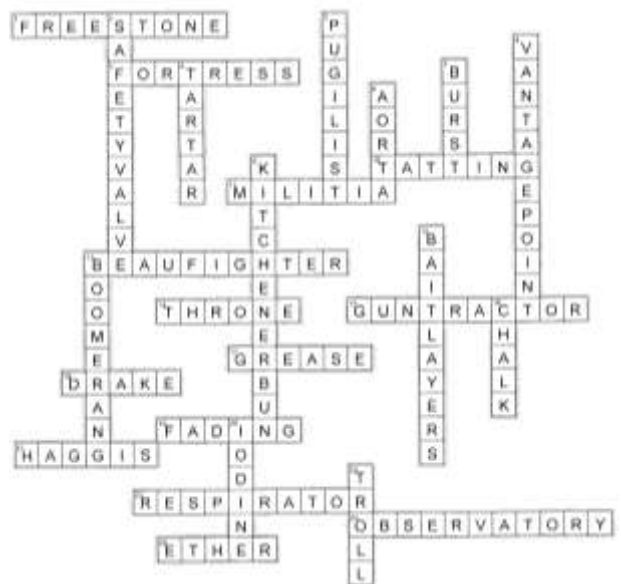
