The purpose of this report is to provide advice on the progress of handing over my responsibilities, as the President of the RAEME National Association (RNA), to the incoming President, Dennis Clarke. I also want to provide readers with a general report on the activities of the RNA. Dennis Clarke of RAV, and the Victorian Vietnams Veterans Chapter, will take over my responsibilities as President in April 2017. He is also the current Vice President of RNA.

Firstly, may I highlight the ongoing work of Ray Norman, and his helpers, in managing the Spanner Pack Program – their work is first class and their results are the envy of other Corps. I am sure all Corps Committee Members have seen the letters of thanks from deployed RAEME soldiers and officers expressing their gratitude.

Secondly, on the technology front, the RNA is extremely fortunate to have a loyal band of webmasters, including Richard Legge, Alex Smithers, Dean Ellis, Pete Matthews, Craig Mahoney, Lyell Wedd and Pat Marley who make up the RAEME National Support Team (RNST). These guys put in an extraordinary amount of personal time to enhancing, maintaining and protecting the RNA website, along with supporting the state organisations with websites and internal processes. The newsletter content will be made up of reports from committee, articles from state organisations and general information and is now almost compiled and ready for publication of the first edition.
