MANAGING OUR CORPS' BRAND



HAPPY 75TH BIRTHDAY RAEME



The Corps on Parade in front of the Australian War Memorial - 1st December 2017

New Badge and Flag for the Army School of Electrical and Mechanical Engineering.

Army and Air Force personnel at the Army School of Electrical and Mechanical Engineering (ASEME) assembled on the 8 Aug 2018 to conduct a Unit Insignia, Flag and Unit Shoulder Patch change ceremony. The changes from the RAEME insignia to the current unit symbology have been brought about to cement the biservice nature of training to RAEME, RAE and RAAF technicians. The reference to the Army Apprentices School insignia; which was also used for the Army College of TAFE, reflects on the school's history and is symbolic of the values that are required of all military technicians, values which remain unchanged to today.



The meaning of the badge (shown left) is as follows. At the apex of the badge is the Crown of the Sovereign, expressing allegiance to the Sovereign, Superiors, Duty and Country. Superimposed on a cogwheel, which represents trade and technical training, is the English Cross of St. George, depicting the virtues and development of character. The St. George's Cross is then overlaid with crossed, doubled–edged swords, representing military qualities of courage, discipline and physical fitness. Superimposed upon the swords and the cross is a flaming torch of learning.

Prior to becoming ASEME, RAEME Training Centre was the Corps school, which all members of RAEME attended throughout their career to develop technical mastery. Today ASEME conducts initial training for ground technicians, as well as Army aviation technicians, as they progress through their careers. In the future, ASEME may also include elements of the junior officer training. It will continue to have an important part to play in the provision of maintenance management training and development.

The Association ANZAC Day March co-ordinator will again be John Howard, look out for him and/or the Association Banner

The RAEME Vietnam Veteran's group march under their own banner and they are looking for as many RAEME Vietnam Veterans as possible to march with them.

The route is the same as last year and Salutes (banners to be lowered on the "eyes right") are to be paid at the National War Memorial, the South African War Memorial on North Terrace and the Vice-Regal Saluting point on the Eastern side of King William Road near the Parade Ground at Torrens Training Depot.

Vehicles will be available for veterans who can no longer make the distance. Please let Don Harvy know (08) 7007 4470, mobile (0412 021 411) or email (harvy@adam.com.au) if you require a seat.

The vehicles will return passengers to Pulteney Street immediately after the marchers have been dismissed at the end of the March. The RSL is providing the vehicle(s) and they will form a "Pod" of vehicles within each group. This is to prevent marchers directly behind the veterans from being forced to breathe exhaust fumes. Carers: One carer or wheelchair pusher is permitted to assist a veteran within unit ranks. Wheelchairs to be in front row.

March Conduct and Paying of Compliments

Unit flags, banners and roundels are to be lowered for all salutes. Yellow unit identification signs are to remain upright and facing the front at the saluting points, except on approaching the Vice-Regal, where they are turned half-right for the salute on the order EYES-RIGHT and then returned to face the front on the order EYES-FRONT.

Toilet facilities are shown on the map on Page 12.

After the March:

Food, refreshments, Two Up and other entertainment is usually available at Torrens Parade Ground if you wish to partake after the march.

The Army Museum will be open from 7.00am to 3.00pm for visitors. A great way to finish the march and rediscover South Australia's military history.






