Readers of the newsletter may be aware of CFN Douglas Borlace who was killed in action in July 1968 while serving in South Vietnam. Doug was the first RAEME member to die in Vietnam and his sacrifice has been acknowledged and remembered with the naming of the Gallipoli Barracks ORS Mess being named after him. Doug is buried in the Stirling Cemetery in the Adelaide Hills and in 2004 the Association installed and dedicated a small plaque on the gravesite. As this year is the fiftieth anniversary of Doug's death, the committee agreed it would be appropriate to recognise this and also look at ways to further acknowledge Doug and his service.

Thanks to a lot of effort by Geoff Parker, Bob Killoran and Mike Cully we have managed to get in principle agreement between the Association, Adelaide Hills Council and the family of Doug Borlace to refurbish the existing plaque and have an interpretive sign board built and erected at the gravesite. To fund this body of work we applied for a financial grant through the Centenary of ANZAC program ran by the South Australian Government.

In breaking news, we have been advised our application has been successful so we can now commence the processes of having the work done. We will keep everyone informed on the progress and importantly we will be arranging a suitable date and time to hold an appropriate ceremony when the work is completed.

Over the past few years the association has managed to build and now maintain a good financial position largely due to the funds raised by running the BBQs at Bunnings when they are offered to us. On Friday 21<sup>st</sup> Sept the Association ran the BBQ at the Noarlunga Bunnings. Thanks to the those who managed to make it on the day and contribute to what was quite a good result for the bank balance. Any time we can run these BBQs we try to advertise the date so as many people as possible are aware and may be able to assist, so please keep in mind that even helping for 2 or 3 hours makes a huge contribution on the day.

The next activity for the Association is our AGM followed by our annual Birthday BBQ. Full details will be advertised so please put Saturday 1 December in the diary and hopefully we will see a good number attend. Till next time



by local artist Brian Budgen and was funded by a donation from the AEME/RAEME Association.



# **RAEME CORPS CONFERENCE 2018**



The RAEME Corps Conference will be held from Tue 23 to Wed 24 Oct 18 at Randwick Barracks, Sydney.

In a break with previous Corps Conferences, there will be no Working Groups conducted during the Conference. Rather, Topic Leaders will coordinate the work of RAEME personnel on select topics throughout the year, producing a discussion paper for review prior to presentation at the Conference. Conference attendees will be required to discuss the recommendations of the Corps topics and then reach a decision on the best Course of Action.

The decisions of the Corps Conference will then form official Corps opinion on the topics, with the result briefed to the Chief of Army, and a succinct list of Corps topic talking/briefing points for all personnel.

A <u>Sharepoint page</u> has been setup to manage the contributions of personnel to the topics. If you wish to contribute, please either post in the topic forums, or contact the topic leader and volunteer. It is expected that supervisors should be able to use these topics for Professional Development of themselves and their personnel.

The following are the Corps Conference themes and selected topics, and the Topic Leaders:

This activity is for all serving and ex-serving RAEME members, their family and friends. Please tell all non Association RAEME personnel you know it is on and invite




them to join us. It is a great opportunity to renew old acquaintances and reminisce over a drink or two.


