RAEME - SA “SOLDIER OF THE YEAR” AWARDS

2024 celebrates the 20th Anniversary of the first RAEME - SA “Soldier of the Year” award presentation. The “Soldier of the Year” awards were never intended to compete with the RAEME “Craftsman of the Year” awards, but were intended to cover both Craftsmen and Corporals who were later achievers in their trade and acknowledge the great service they provide to the Corps. Since 2004 RAEME - SA has continued to provide two annual awards to recognise the performance of the best SERCAT 7 and SERCAT 5 Soldier (CFN or CPL) serving within South Australia.

All RAEME Craftsmen/Corporals posted to units located in South Australia are eligible for the award. The purpose of the Awards is to identify and recognise annually the most outstanding SERCAT 7 and SERCAT 5 RAEME soldier within South Australia. The award is judged for the period 1 January to 30 October each year.

Each year Unit OCs and/or ASMs are requested to forward nominations to the President of RAEME - SA. Nominations requested include details of:

- trade and regimental abilities
- involvement in extra activities including community activities, sporting bodies, hobbies, civilian studies, etc.
- any other outstanding attributes.

The President and Vice President, after consultation with the Senior RAEME Representative SA and relevant OCs, ASMs, select the winners for each category.

The winners of the awards are presented with an appropriately engraved trophy as well as a framed certificate signed by the President and Colonel Commandant / Senior RAEME Representative (SA). Presentation of both the SERCAT 7 and SERCAT 5 “Soldier of the Year” Awards are normally made at the Corps Birthday activity or at an appropriate parade or ceremony.

RAEME – SA also present a “Best Overall Cadet at 43 ACU” award every year.

VALE MAJ Ray Norman (Retd)

Raymond Norman passed away on
Tuesday 29 October 2024, at 80 years of age



Born on 3 May 1944 in Oakleigh, Victoria, Ray attended Swinburn Technical College and studied as a vehicle mechanic, before enlisting in the Australian Army. His dedication and leadership saw him serve on operations in South Vietnam from February 1970 to February 1971, attached to the 4th Field Regiment Light Aid Detachment, holding the rank of Sergeant. Ray's military journey was marked by distinction, including as the Corps Regimental Sergeant Major (RSM) in 1982.

For his exemplary service as RSM - Logistic Command, Ray was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) in the Military Division in 1987. Later, Ray received his commission and ultimately retired as a Major, having dedicated over 30 years to the Army.

Ray's commitment to the Corps extended well beyond his military career. He served as Chair of both the

RAEME Association Queensland and the RAEME National Association. As the driving force behind Operation Spanner Pack over the last decade, Ray oversaw the distribution of care packs to RAEME soldiers deployed globally. His contributions earned him Honorary Life Membership of the RAQ in 2015, followed by the prestigious Chairman's Award in 2018. Ray held RAQ Honorary Life Member No. 2, a testament to his early and enduring dedication to the Association.

Raymond is survived by his wife Karen and family.

VALE MAJ David Moon (Retd)

It is with deep sadness that we inform the RAEME community of the passing of
Major David Edward Moon (Retd), on 12 September 2024 aged 85.



Born on 25th May 1939 in Adelaide, he enlisted in the Army in 1955 as a 10th Intake Army Apprentice (Fitter and Turner). He served over 27 years, with many postings in Australia, including service overseas in the UK and PNG.

After retiring in 1982, he remained active in the 4WD community as President of the Queensland and National Associations, and as a 4x4 trainer. He was also a passionate shooter, involved with gun clubs in Toowoomba, Bundaberg, and Fraser Coasts, holding various positions including Club Captain.

RAEME in COMMAND

The new Commanding Officer for Joint Logistics Unit (South) at RAAF Edinburgh is a RAEME LTCOL. - **LTCOL Gareth Pihl**

Lieutenant Colonel Gareth Pihl enlisted into the Australian Army Reserve as a rifleman in 2002. Upon completion of his tertiary studies, he attended the Royal Military College – Duntroon, graduating into the Royal Australian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers in 2006.

Lieutenant Colonel Pihl gained junior regimental experience at the 2nd Cavalry Regiment and 5th Aviation Regiment before serving at the Army Aviation Systems Program Office, where he was the Lead Avionics Design Engineer for the Army's fleet of Black Hawk helicopters. He then posted to Aviation Branch, Headquarters Forces Command, as a capability manager. It was during this posting that Lieutenant Colonel Pihl deployed on Operation SLIPPER as the S4 of Rotary Wing Group – 8.

Lieutenant Colonel Pihl has fulfilled postings and appointments in training and recruitment. In 2014, he was the Senior Instructor – Multi-Role Helicopter at the Rotary Wing Aircraft Maintenance School. In 2015, he was posted to Defence Force Recruiting, where his primary role was to recruit the future generation of tri-Service engineers. In 2016-2017, Lieutenant Colonel Pihl was posted to the 7th Signal Regiment as the Officer Commanding, Operational Support Squadron.

After graduating from Australian Command and Staff College (Joint) in 2018, Lieutenant Colonel Pihl had the unique privilege of serving the 7th Combat Brigade as the Deputy Assistant Adjutant and Quartermaster General (DQ). Whilst Lieutenant Colonel Pihl has been fortunate to enjoy several career highlights, this posting marked a distinct high point, and saw him coordinate logistic effects in a dynamic, proactive and adaptive formation. In 2021, he was employed in the roles of Staff Officer Grade One Regional Plans and Staff Officer Grade One Southwest Pacific at Headquarters 1st Division. In these challenging roles, he led the planning of the ADF's regional security cooperation and the coordination of Five-Eyes + 2 activities. He then posted to Headquarters Forces Command as the G43, where he led logistics planning and materiel mounting in support of force generation and contingency responses, as well as logistics policy development. He was then the Forces Command G45, where he oversaw the sustainment of Forces Command's materiel and led its contribution to the Defence Strategic Review rebalance.

Lieutenant Colonel Pihl holds a Bachelor of Engineering (Electrical and Computer Engineering) from the Queensland University of Technology, a Master of Engineering Science (C4ISREW) from the University of New South Wales, and a Master of Military and Defence Studies from the Australian National University.

Lieutenant Colonel Pihl is married to Emily, an orthodontist, and together they have three children – Rory (8), Iona (6) and Freja (4). His hobbies and interests are varied, and include many outdoor activities such as surfing, fishing, mountain biking and running; however, he often finds himself absorbed with house renovations and maintenance when he is back at home in Queensland.
