Treasurer advised we need to transfer Term Deposit monies from Defence Bank due to the closure of the Keswick Branch and difficulties in accessing the Edinburgh Branch. It was approved that the Association Investment account be closed, and the money deposited into a more accessible bank. For resolution by the Committee in 2024.

Election of Office Bearers

New Association Banner.

There has been ongoing correspondence between the Secretary and RAQ. The cost of having the banner made here in Australia can be up to \$6000, however there are cheaper option for about \$2000. Both options include poles/pikes/baldrics etc.



The recommended option is to seek overseas manufacture. Example, the purchase of the RAEME-SA Association Flag.
