COLONEL COMMANDANT'S UPDATE

Hello Everyone

Recently we have had a number of key RAEME position changes within Central Region. We now have a new BC of the Wksp at 16 AD Regt Woodside and a new OC of 107 Fd Wksp Coy 9 CSSB. For your information I am including a brief summary about each of them.

BC Spt Bty, 16 AD Regt

Major Matthew PATCHING

Major Patching was born and educated in Strathalbyn, SA, and enlisted into the Army in Feb 1995. While undergoing initial employment training at the School of Infantry, Singleton, Major Patching was appointed to RMC Duntroon where he graduated to RAEME. His first posting was to



2 Cav Regt (Recon) where he commanded the Technical Support Troop within the A2 echelon during the final stages of the transition from M113 to ASLAV. In 1998 Major Patching was posted to

the Army Recruit Training Centre where he commanded the 25th Platoon, Charlie Company prior to being selected as the Company Second-in-Command.

In 2000 Major Patching was accepted to the University of New South Wales at ADFA to undertake a Bachelor's Degree in Mechanical Engineering; graduating in Dec 2003.

Throughout that posting he was deployed as the SO3 Pers / Log to Operation ANODE in the Solomon Islands and also as the logistics officer for Operation PAKISTAN ASSIST; an opportunity he considers to be the highlight of his career to date. On return from Operation PAKISTAN ASSIST, Major Patching was posted as an instructor to RMC Duntroon.

On promotion to Major in Jan 2007 he took up the appointment as the Senior Career Manager for RAEME at the Soldier Career Management Agency. He deployed as the SO1 Personnel Plans, Headquarters International Security Assistance Force, Operation SLIPPER for seven months from July 2008. On return in Jan 2009 Major Patching took up his current appointment of Battery Commander, Combat Service Support Battery, 16 AD Regt.

Major Patching has four children, two of whom reside with him and his wife Sarah. They enjoy travelling and most sports, and tolerate Major Patching's poor golf game and interest in thoroughbred racing.

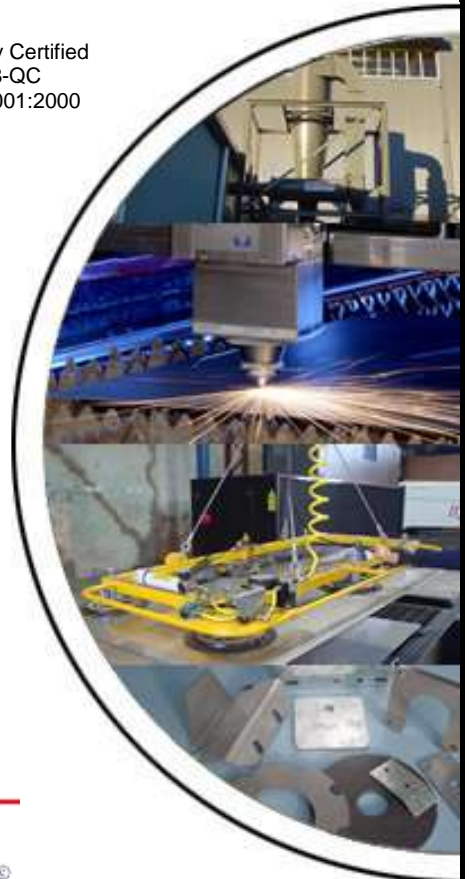

This year is the 70th Anniversary of the commencement of World War 2, in which so many of our Navy, Army and Air Force Reservists served.

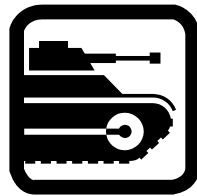

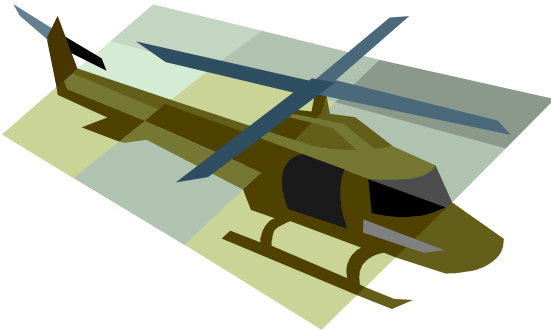

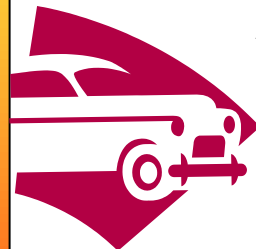
